Important Archive of 19th Century Kilkenny Deeds

An archive of documents relating to families and land holdings in County Kilkenny, comprising leases, wills, marriage settlements, legal correspondence and other papers. Mainly 19th century, but a few of the 18th century (1718 and 1769) and some of the early 20th.

Many of the papers relate to the family of Hutchinson and to lands at Boolyshea (which they bought from Robert Garrett in 1718), Kiltorcan and Derrynahinch (acquired by fee farm grant) and Jerpoint Church (acquired in 1801 by marriage between Richard Hutchinson and Mary daughter of Edward Hunt).

In a curious deed made of 1801 soon after his marriage, Richard Hutchinson grants to Anastatia and Mary Walsh of Derrynahinch an annuity of £20 on condition that they continue to clothe, maintain, educate, support and keep Mary, Judith, John, Abigail and Thomas Hutchinson otherwise Walsh, "reputed children of said Richard".

Through a series of very detailed marriage settlements it is possible to follow the genealogical details of later Hutchinsons and the families with whom they intermarried, and their financial and land transactions. In a curt letter of 1875 to his solicitors John Hutchinson of 89 Waterloo Road, Dublin, instructs that two of his daughters "should be cut out and excluded from any share in my will".

These documents provide an insight into the affairs of a Kilkenny family of substance, but which did not meet the qualifications for an entry in Burke's Landed Gentry and whose genealogy is therefore not easy to trace.

The archive also contains a number of documents relating to other families of Co. Kilkenny during the second half of the 19th century, mainly of the farming class rather than of gentry status. The largest file contains 25 documents of the Phelan family of Ballyragget, 1824-1897. As an archive, w.a.f.

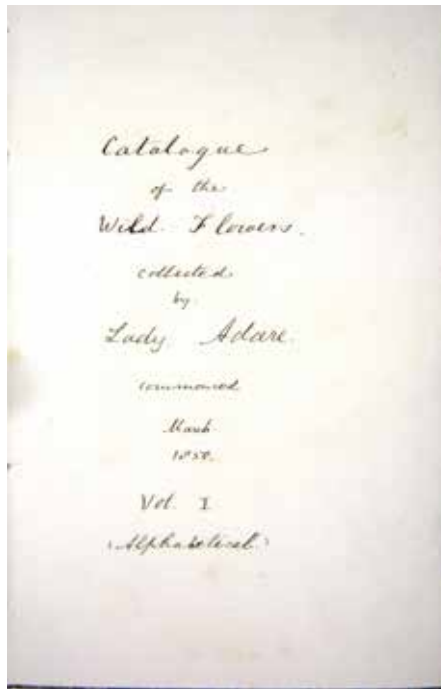

A large collection of plant samples, each pinned within a paper folder. There is a small index volume entitled "Catalogue of the Wild Flowers collected by Lady Adare, commenced March 1850." Viscount Adare was the title borne by the eldest son and heir of the Earl of Dunraven. In March 1850 it was held by the son of the second Earl, who had married in 1836 Augusta, daughter of Thomas Goold of Dublin, a Master in Chancery, and Elizabeth, daughter of the Rev. Brinsley Nixon, Rector of Painstown, Co. Meath. Augusta was thus the "Lady Adare" who compiled the collection. In August 1850 she became Lady Dunraven when her husband succeeded to the earldom. She died in 1866.

The collection includes several bundles with individual titles, E.G.:

- "Rare plants from the Northern Regions"
- "Rare plants illustrative of North Pole botany, collected and preserved during Captain Parry's last expedition". All are dated 1825. Captain Sir William Parry was a celebrated explorer; he carried out an expedition to the Arctic in 1824-25, returning safely in his ship the *Hecla*, though the accompanying ship the *Fury* was lost.
- Rare plants from Crossmount (a historic house in Kinloch Rannoch, Scotland) and Harrogate (a spa town in North Yorkshire), all dated 1849.

Important Manuscript Volume From The Napoleonic Wars

Manningham (Col. Coote) A fine manuscript volume bound in reversed calf, in excellent condition. Entitled "Regulations for the Rifle Corps formed at Blatchinton Barracks under the command of Colonel Manningham, 25th August 1800." Handwritten throughout, in very clear writing. Colonel Coote Manningham (c.1765-1809) was a professional soldier who gained considerable experience as a commander of light infantry during the early stages of the French Revolutionary Wars. In 1800 he and Lt-Col. William Stewart proposed the formation of a separate corps of light infantrymen, armed with the newly developed Baker Rifle, which had a longer range and was more accurate than the traditional "Brown Bess" musket, though it was much slower to load. Thus was born the Rifle Corps, which became the 95th Rifle Regiment and then the Rifle Brigade. It played an important role in the battles fought against the armies of Napoleon (who imprudently despised this newfangled weapon). The 95th Rifles have become famous in popular fiction thanks to the novels of Bernard Cornwell featuring Rifleman Richard Sharpe and the TV series that followed. Their founder Colonel Manningham fell ill during the retreat to Corunna, died upon his return to England, and was buried in Westminster Abbey, As a m/ss, w.a.f. (1) €450 - 650

Contemporary Copy of Documents Relating to Sir John Franklin's Arctic Expedition, (1847 - 48)

[Shingleton (Richard)] A folio Sheet with contemporary copies of the letter written by Captain Gore in June 1847, a request to the finder in several languages, the letter written by Captain Crozier after the death of Franklin, and a list of articles found. The 19th Century British public were fascinated by the idea of polar exploration, in particular the search for the elusive "North-West Passage" connecting Europe and Asia. In 1845 a well-equipped expedition under the command of Sir John Franklin, an experienced naval officer, set off in two ships, the *Erebus* and the *Terror*. They were never seen again. Following reports of the discovery of artefacts and of Inuit testimony, Franklin's widow bought and equipped the steam yacht *Fox* and organised an expedition to search for remains of her husband and his crew. It was commanded by Dundalk native Captain Francis Leopold McClintock and had a crew of 25. The *Fox* left Aberdeen on 1 July 1857 and after many adventures returned to London on 21 September 1859, having discovered many artefacts and the last written communications from the last survivors, including the date of Franklin's death. McClintock became a hero, published a best-selling account of his experiences, and was knighted. A modern account of the expedition is given in *The Arctic Fox: Francis Leopold McClintock, discoverer of the fate of Franklin* by David Murphy (Cork, Collins 2004). The documents found by McClintock's men have been published and are well known; what makes this copy unique is that it is contemporary and belonged to a member of the crew of the *Fox*, the officers' steward Richard Shingleton, and comes by direct provenance from the family. A Soldier's Letter to His Mother in Waterford, 1843

Manuscript: Field (Michael) An A.L.s. from Michael Field, a soldier in one of the military barracks at Chatham, to his mother in Waterford. The soldiers are stationed there in order to escort convicts en route to Van Diemen's Lane, and he expects that his unit will receive embarkation orders soon. He describes the wretched conditions - overcrowding, severe duty, provisions expensive and of the worst quality - "I have never put my foot in such a den" - and requests the prayers of his family in helping him to endure his present hardship. There is no mention of his father, presumably dead, and his mother is living with her sister and her husband Sergeant James Mahony in John's Street, Waterford. He enquires after various members of the family and sends greetings from "Johanna and the children." An evocative item, of local interest. BRITISH RULE IN INDIA, 1778-1783: LETTERS TO SIR THOMAS RUMBOLD (22 items)
Rumbold (Sir T.) Archive – Historical Background

British presence in India during the 18th century was represented by the East India Company, which had its own civil service and army. It was divided into three "presidencies" - Bombay, Bengal and Madras. Its main colonial rival was the French *Compagnie des Indes*. Wars against native rulers were frequent, and when Britain and France were fighting each other in Europe they fought in India as well.

The Treaty of Paris (1763) recognised British supremacy in India, allowing the French to retain a number of trading posts, the most important of which was Pondicherry. However, French aid to the revolting American colonists resulted in Britain declaring war on France in March 1778, and fighting continued until news of the peace negotiations at Versailles reached India in June 1783.

Meanwhile, the British were also involved on two fronts with native rulers - with the Maratha Kingdom in Central India (1775-1782) and with the Kingdom of Mysore in the South (1780-1784).

Sir Thomas Rumbold, to whom these letters were written, was a veteran of the Indian administration, in which he made a fortune. He served as Governor of Madras from his arrival in February 1778 until his departure in April 1780. On his return to England he was impeached for misgovernment and embezzlement, like Clive before him and Warren Hastings after him - all three cases failed.

The letters

Fragment of transcript of a letter from Anthony Sadlier, Mazulipatam, May 1778.

Rumbold planned to collect land revenues directly from the Zamindars (rich landowners) rather than working through the civil servants, thereby eliminating corruption. Sadlier is explaining the consequences of summoning the Zamindars to Madras for this purpose.

Six letters from Guillaume de Bellecombe, May 1778 to June 1779.

De Bellecombe was the French governor of Pondicherry, which was besieged by the British and surrendered after a ten-week siege on 18 October 1778. His first three letters cover the period from Rumbold's arrival in Madras to the outbreak of hostilities; the second three concern the niceties of his period in confinement after the surrender and the embarkation of his troops.

Five letters from Sir Edward Vernon, August to October 1778

Vernon was in command of the British naval force in Indian waters, his flagship being the *Ripon*. His letters report three events. On 10 August 1778 he fought an action against the French off Pondicherry; it was indecisive - although the French withdrew, the British were too badly damaged to pursue them. A fortnight later, one of his ships captured a French merchant vessel, the *Sartine*, which Vernon pressed into service for the siege of Pondicherry. Finally, he reports the capture of two more French merchant ships.

Six letters from Colonel Hector Munro, January to March 1779

Munro was in Tanjore to collect the tribute exacted from the Rajah, who owed his throne to British intervention in 1776. He reports on the difficulty of meeting the Rajah, who is ill ("much pained by a *fstula in ano*") and whose principal adviser is obstructive. He recommends intervention - "necessity has no law". However, he leaves Tanjore in some frustration.

Letter from Warren Hastings, February 1779

Warren Hastings was Governor of the Bengal Presidency from 1772 to 1785 and was later the subject of the 18th century's most notorious impeachment case. His letter to Rumbold is written from Fort William, capital of the Bengal Presidency.

The first Anglo-Maratha War had broken out in 1775. Hastings has just received news (confirmed by Rumbold) of the defeat of a British army on its way to Poona at the Battle of Wadgaon, and the humiliating treaty that followed it (17 Jan.). He discusses the presumed repercussions on British "street-cred" with the Marathas. Rumbold has suggested that the force commanded by Colonel Thomas Goddard, which was advancing from Oudh towards Bombay, should withdraw to Bengal, but Hastings does not agree to this.

Letter from Colonel Des Auvergnés, March 1779

Des Auvergnés was colonel of the French Regiment of Pondicherry. Since the town's surrender he has been on parole and is now about to

depart. He thanks Rumbold for the invitation to join him in a farewell dinner and accepts the offer of a carriage to take him there. Encloses a note of same date commends to the governor the officers and men of his regiment, "que j'aime bien".

Letter from John Hollond, May 1779

Hollond had acted as Rumbold's emissary to the Nizam of the Deccan. He has now arrived as British Resident at Hyderabad and been well received by the Soubah. However, he reports that the Nabob is strongly opposed to his taking up residence in the city and will no doubt influence the Soubah against it.

Letter from Paul Benfield (undated, but c. June 1783)

Benfield was a wealthy financier and "wheeler-dealer" in India. His machinations caused him to be recalled to England, but he returned to Madras in 1781 and remained there for seven years, distrusted by all parties.

His letter is undated but must have been written in late June or July 1783, by which time Rumbold was back in England. Hostilities between Britain and France had officially ceased on 20 January. However, fighting continued in India between the forces of the East India Company and the Mysorean army and its French allies. Tipu Sahib, who had succeeded his father Hyder Ali as ruler of Mysore, succeeded in capturing Bednore (28 April). The British laid siege to the French garrison at Cuddalore, but news of the peace arrived on 30 June and the siege came to an end.

Benfield's letter refers to all these events and lays responsibility for Britain's misfortunes in India squarely on the shoulders of the corrupt, lazy and inefficient civil government. Pots and kettles ... !

Assessment

This small but diverse collection of letters throws some interesting light onto a confusing period in the British presence in India in the late 18th century. Most of the correspondents achieved fame of one kind or another: Sir Thomas Rumbold as a controversial administrator, Admiral Vernon as a naval officer and pioneer balloonist, General Sir Hector Munro as a ruthless military reformer and evictor of tenants from his Highland estates, and Paul Benfield as a "rags to riches to rags" financier, while De Bellecombe subsequently became Governor of Haiti.

Manuscript: *Thoughts on the Present State of Ireland, July 15th 1798*, 12pp 4to (loose), written in a strong and very legible hand, not signed, but relates a very personal view by someone who was very well informed. It treats in detail the background of the rebellion, '... But the moment Ireland set up for Herself and became nominally an Independent Kingdom .. These were likewise supposed to be stipulated for, in a Treaty made with the Catholic Body in London, in April 1792, with the English Ministry. That Treaty being broken thro, in the Summer of that year, by the Irish Administration, who all the World knows is at all times, created by, and dependant upon, the English one. This lay'd the foundation of the present & Civil War...'

It goes on to describe England's plight

with France & in the Colonies. 'The Southern Catholics still however continue to show Loyalty and good will to the Kings Troops employed to repel the Invasion of Dec. 1796 - Trusting that this Loyalty, unequivocally shewn on this trying occasion must put the seal on their Emancipation...' ... when the Prince of Wales's offer to come to Ireland to complete it [Emancipation] 'was overruled by one voice only in the British Cabinet, from that time the Inferior Catholic Clergy, joined the United Irishmen...'

'The Northern Republicans at all Times...? to Monarchy, seeing the successes of their Brother Republicans in France, and the Exasperated and determined Spirit of the Irish Catholics...'

It deals with the Irish Directory, Whig Club, Orange Clubs, and Finally, 'I do not think myself able to prescribe a remedy, but the contrary Conduct of conciliation, Humanity, affability, and good temper seem likely to succeed better with the Irish, who are a warm hearted, friendly but a strong headed People ...' 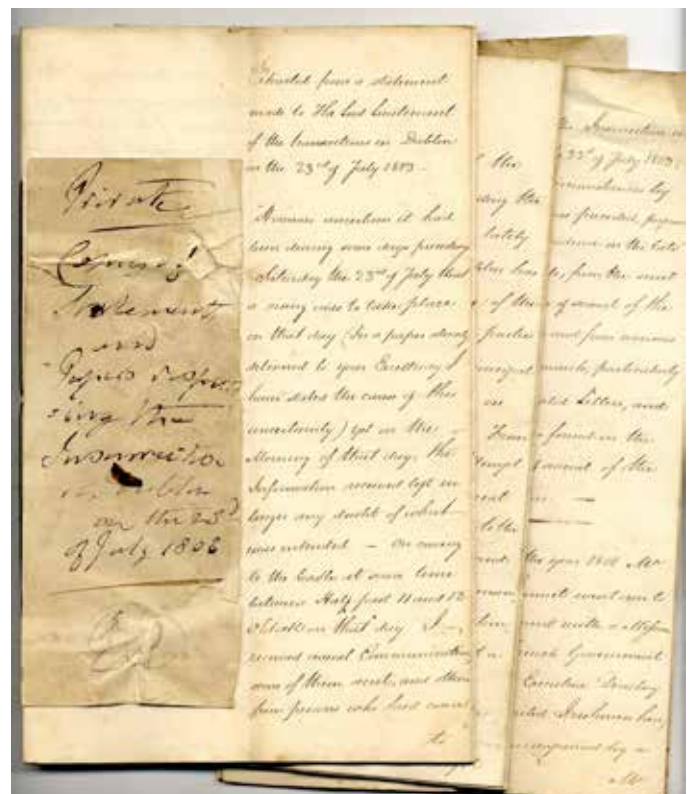

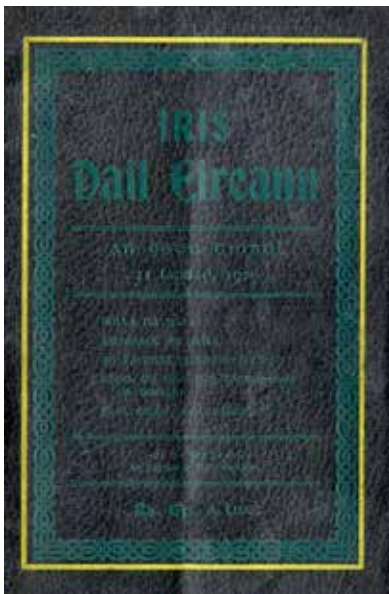

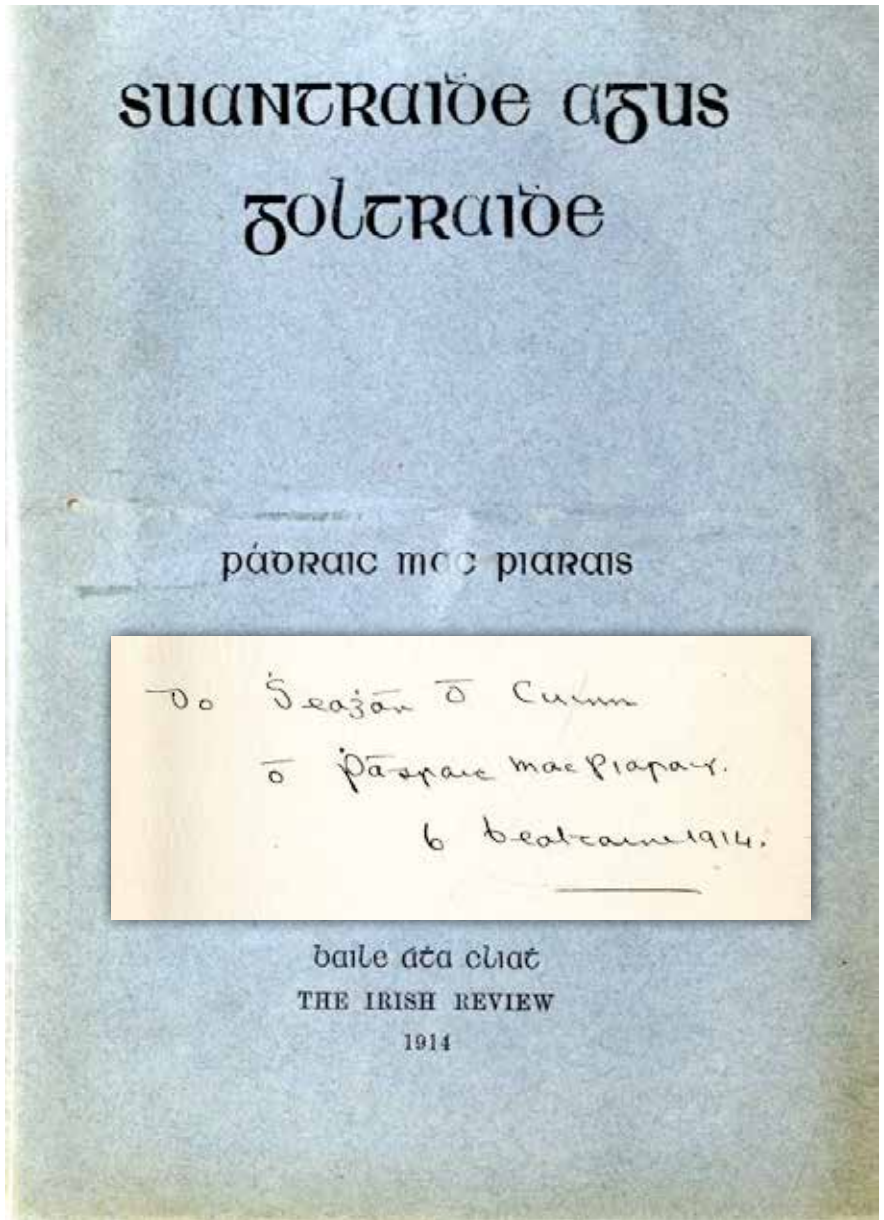

**IMPORTANT DOCUMENTS
RELATING TO KEVIN BARRY**

(Lots 400 - 410)

Kevin Barry was born in Dublin in 1902, the fourth of seven children of Thomas Barry, dairyman, and Mary, née Dowling. His early childhood was spent on the family farm at Tombeagh, Co. Carlow, but the Barrys returned to Dublin and at the age of fourteen, already imbued with republican ideals, he entered Belvedere College. He was a member of the championship Junior Rugby Cup team, and also played for the senior team. In 1918, on the formation of a school hurling club, he became its secretary and was also an enthusiastic player. In 1919 he won a Dublin Corporation scholarship to UCD, where he studied Medicine.

A member of the IRA since the age of fifteen, he took part in several actions during the War of Independence. On 20 September 1920, an attempt to ambush a British Army lorry misfired, one soldier was shot dead, two were mortally wounded, and Barry was captured. After some rough handling by his captors, he was imprisoned in Mountjoy Jail. On 20 October he was tried for murder and condemned to death by hanging. He was executed on 1 November.

Barry's youthfulness, his bravery under interrogation, his cheerfulness in the face of death, and his execution so soon after the death on hunger strike of Terence McSwiney, made him a Republican martyr - a status he has maintained ever since.

The Kevin Barry Memorial Committee Records (1930 - 1934)

Barry (Kevin) A large folder containing minutes, correspondence, accounts, lists of subscribers etc. of the Kevin Barry Memorial Committee.

Soon after his execution, a committee was established to erect a memorial to Kevin Barry. Meetings were held and funds collected. However, affairs languished until 1929, when the committee was re-established and a determined effort was made to bring matters to a conclusion. There was much discussion as to who exactly should be commemorated, who should subscribe, and what form the memorial might take.

It was eventually decided to erect a large stained glass window in UCD, Barry's alma mater, to celebrate his death and his place in Irish history. Eight significant scenes in the Irish struggle for freedom were selected, and the commission was given to the Harry Clarke Studio. Clarke himself died in 1931 but his place was taken by Richard King, a native of Castlebar who had joined the firm in 1928. It was King who designed the work and brought it to fruition. There is a sketch of the proposed design on the back of an advertisement for Harry Clarke Studio.

It was intended that the subscribers should be graduates of UCD, regardless of their party politics. An offer of support from the College's Fianna Fáil Cumann provoked a furious response from the Secretary of the Fine Gael Cumann, who signed himself grandly as "de Riva O'Phelan of the Decies" - "Any attempt by any political organisation or unit to make party capital by auctioning the name of Kevin Barry is deplorable."

The Committee was further embarrassed by a late contribution of \$100 sent via the Irish Press by one John O'Donoghue IV of New York. His accompanying letter was printed in the newspaper on 28

December 1934. After castigating the Committee for the long delay in providing a memorial to Kevin Barry, he continued: "In Germany, where the writer spends several months annually, all of the youthful martyrs of Adolf Hitler's splendid movement are immortalized in song and prose, and statues are erected to their memories. It is not every land that can produce great young heroes like Kevin Barry and Horst Wessel [author of the Nazi Party anthem], the student martyr of Germany. The latter was murdered in 1930 by a Communist, and today his memory is held in reverence by each and every German."

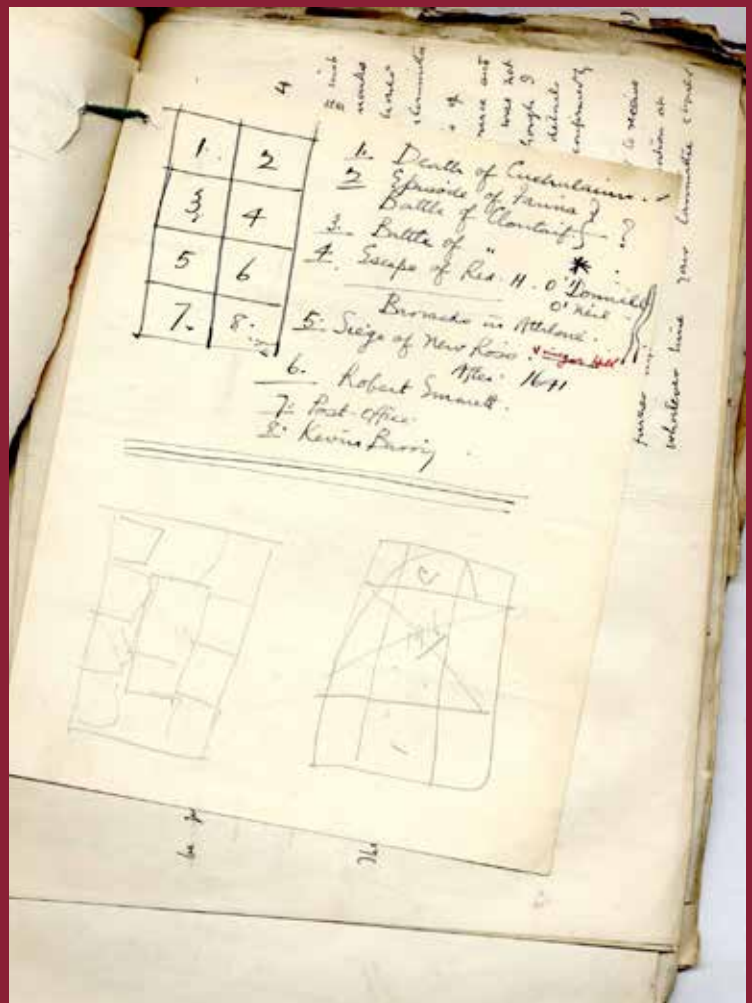
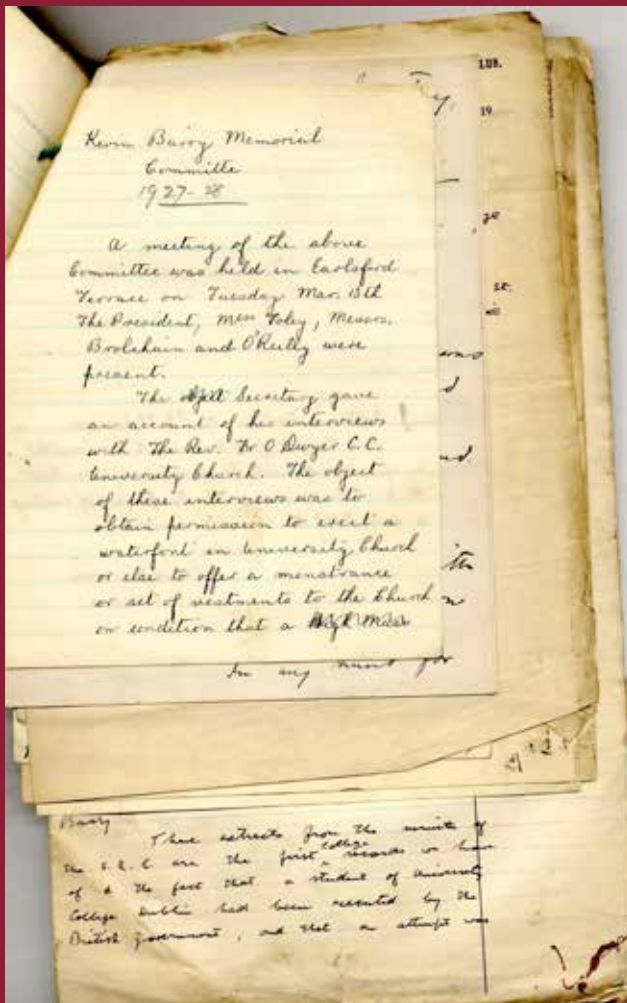
While negotiations were still in train, a general election was called for 24 January 1933, and the folder contains election manifestoes for UCD candidates Conor A. Maguire, Helena Concannon, Michael Hayes and Patrick McGilligan.

The memorial was finally unveiled on 1 November 1934, the fourteenth anniversary of Barry's execution.

The folder also contains a copy of the National Student magazine for December 1945, containing an editorial on Kevin Barry on the 25th anniversary of his execution, and an obituary of Eoin MacNeill, who had died in October. A highly important collection. As an Archive, w.a.f. (1)
