Joseph Pike of Dunsland, Glanmire, Chairman of the Cork Steamship Co. and a former high sheriff of the county, was (despite his Quaker upbringing) an enthusiastic and suspiciously successful card player. One of his favourite venues was the Cork County Club, of which he was a trustee. Richard Pigott Beamish, a fellow trustee, being made aware of rumours that Pike was cheating, demanded that the matter be investigated by the club committee. Pike sued Beamish for libel, and the case was heard at the Four Courts on 8 May 1894. The proceedings were followed avidly by members of the gentry, both in and out of the courtroom. After a hearing that lasted ten days, the jury gave its verdict, deciding with admirable impartiality that Pike was innocent of cheating and Beamish was innocent of malice. 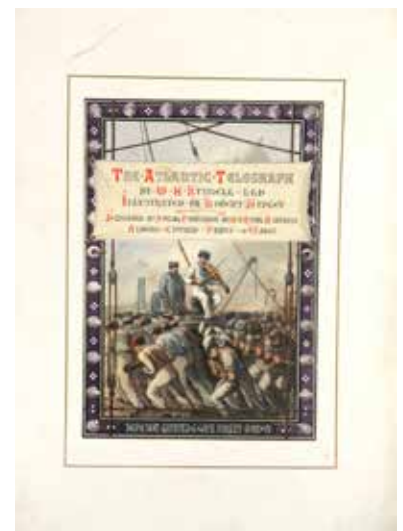

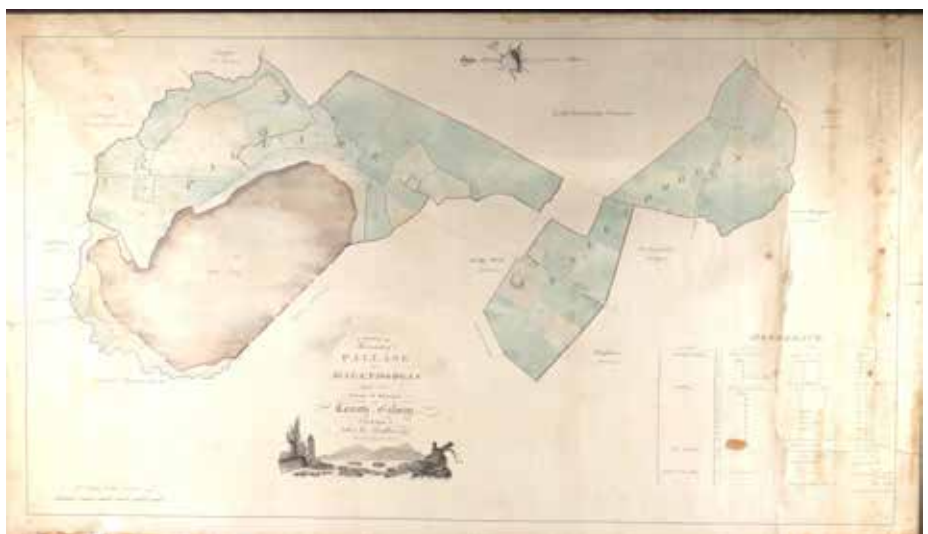

Important Day Family Archive

Co. Kerry: An Archive, mainly pictorial, of the Day family, descendants of the Rev. John Day, Rector of Kiltallagh (d. 1817), assembled by Kathleen Mary Agnes Day. Born in 1881, the fourth child and only daughter of the Rev. Maurice Day and Charlotte Ottley of Moyola, co. Antrim, she lived with her parents until her father's death in 1923, and spent much of her later life in Windsor, where she died unmarried.

The distinguished lawyer and politician Robert Day (1746-1841) was a collateral ancestor; but the Days were above all stalwarts of the Church of Ireland: Kathleen's grandfather was Dean of Ardfert; her father was Bishop of Clogher; her brother was Bishop of Ossory and ultimately (but briefly) Archbishop of Armagh; a grand-uncle was Bishop of Cashel and Waterford; and a cousin was Dean of Waterford.

The collection comprises photograph albums of places where the family lived or went on holiday, sketchbooks, topographical drawings, genealogical information, news cuttings, and a large assortment of loose family photos (most of which have been captioned by Kathleen Day), some mounted and framed, some printed on glass or tin.

Highlights include:

- A framed series of 7 silhouettes, with at centre Kathleen's great-grandmother Arabella Day (née Godfrey), surrounded by six of her children, all identified on the back.
- A collection of miniatures and silhouettes of members of the Day family.
- Album bound in red-brown morocco with gold tooling (18th century?), 53 x 39 cm, containing 3 illuminated addresses to the Rev. Maurice Day, acknowledging his services as pastor, regretting his imminent departure, and congratulating him on his new appointment: (1) from the parishioners of Killiney, March 1894, with Celtic scrolled borders and vignette of the church. Published by the Royal Irish Association for Employment of Women; (2) from the parishioners of St Luke's [Cork], 28 February

1870, with elaborately decorated borders with the Day coat of arms, Celtic scrolls, flowers and beasts; (3) from the St Matthias' Young Men's Christian Association, February 1873. 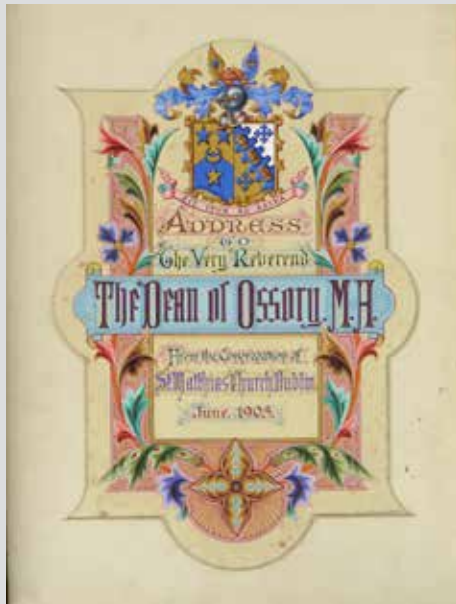

After James Malton (1761-1803)

View of the Law Courts, Dublin, approx. 41.5cms x 61cms (16½" x 24")

This impressive sepia and watercolour painting of the Four Courts in Dublin, by an unknown artist, is closely based on James Malton's engraving of the same subject. The painting appears to date from around 1800, and so would have been done not long after Malton's aquatint view was published, in the 1790's. Although signed 'Malton' it is probably by a follower of the artist.

* An English-born engraver and watercolourist, James Malton moved to Ireland as a child in the 1780's, and following his father in taking up the profession of architectural draughtsman, working for a time in the offices of architect James Gandon. Leaving this employment, he began working as an artist, and in 1790 submitted two drawings to the Society of Artists in London. He is best known for a series of twenty five aquatint and etching prints entitled *A Picturesque and Descriptive View of the City of Dublin*, published in the 1790's. Several of the buildings he

drew, including the Law Courts, had been designed by his former employer James Gandon. Although Malton hoped to capitalise on the growth in prosperity of Dublin, the passing of the Act of Union reduced the importance of the city, and he was obliged to maintain his ties with London, exhibiting frequently there, at the Royal Academy. Among the works he showed at the RA were seventeen views of Dublin in Indian ink and watercolour, mostly depicting the same subjects as his published prints. Larger than the original plates, they also differed in detail, with some figures removed and other added. While it is tempting to see this sepia and watercolour painting of the Law Courts as an autograph work by Gandon, it lacks his firm grasp of architectural perspective and his ability to include figures and carriages rendered with elegance and flair, as exemplified in his book *Designs for Rural Retreats*, published in 1802. He died the following year, 1803.

William Hurst Ashpitel (1776-1852)

Design for Ormond Bridge, Dublin 1805,

watercolour on paper, approx. 107cms x 38cms (42" x 15"), framed. (1)

* Over the centuries on the River Liffey, there have been several bridges built at Ormond Quay, at the point that links Winetavern Street to the South, with Chancery Place and the Four Courts to the North. In 1802, the humpback bridge designed by the Semple brothers in the mid-eighteenth century was swept away in a severe storm. A public competition was held to find an architect to design a replacement, and William Hurst Ashpitel of London was among those who entered the competition. His design won, as recorded in the inscription on this drawing: "Design for Ormond Bridge over the River Liffey, Dublin, submitted to the Corporation agreeably to public advertisement approv'd by them and honor'd with the premium of sixty guineas W. H. Ashpitel Architect 1805."

Ashpitel's drawing shows an elevation of the proposed bridge as seen from the east. Painted in sepia ink and Indian ink washes, it is a fine example of architectural rendering, and an important document in Irish architectural history, particularly as the architects of Ormond Bridge (now named O'Donovan Rossa Bridge) have heretofore been identified only as George Knowles and James Savage. The bridge, as built, is still there today and is essentially the same structure shown in Ashpitel's prize-winning drawing. Consisting of a wide and gently cambered roadway over three elliptical arches, it is Neo-Classical in design. In the drawing, a barge, sails aloft, navigates underneath the bridge, demonstrating the ample space provided by its graceful arches, while carriages, carts and pedestrians cross overhead. The balustrades are

fitted with iron lanterns, and the arches embellished with Greek fret patterns. The entrance colonnade to the Four Courts can be seen on the right. In the background can be seen a temporary bridge, erected to take traffic while the new bridge was being built. Although Ashpitel's drawing is dated 1805, the new bridge took almost a decade to build, and Knowles and Savage were the architects employed to oversee the works. It is at a point on the river close to the original Viking settlement of Dublin, and many archaeological finds came to light during the years of construction. Completed in 1813 it was formally opened two years later and was initially named Richmond Bridge, after the Viceroy. Great pride was taken in the fact that the central arch had a longer span than any bridge in London. There were a few changes made to Ashpitel's design. The fret patterning was omitted, and keystones carved with Riverine heads were added, but otherwise the bridge today is identical to the one depicted in his drawing.

A pupil of Daniel Asher Alexander, William Hurst Ashpitel was an architect and surveyor who worked mainly in London. Having assisted Alexander in the design and building of the London docks, he was later a pupil of John Rennie the Elder, working on the Kennet and Avon canal, and also on the tunnel that ran underneath the city of Bath. After working in partnership with James Savage, Ashpitel, who was a member of the Surveyors' Club, set up his own practice in London. Working in both Classical and Gothic styles, he was involved in projects in Whitechapel and Hackney. Among the buildings he designed was a house for Sir Charles Talbot at Deepdene, in Surrey. Ashpitel's son Arthur was also an architect, and a noted writer on architecture.

Michael Angelo Hayes (1820-1877)

A View of Sackville Street (1854), watercolour and ink on paper, approx. 49cms x 67cms (19" x 26"), heightened with gouache, framed. (1)

In 1854, Michael Angelo Hayes painted *A View of Sackville Street*, showing the Post Office, Nelson's Pillar, and the palatial Mart of the Messrs. McSwiney and Co. The view shows Sackville Street (now O'Connell Street) with, on the right, the new department store 'McSwiney, Delaney & Co', due to open in May the following year. A business venture by George Delaney and Peter Paul McSwiney, some thirty years later it was re-named Clery & Co., but continued in business. In the mid 1860's, when McSwiney was elected Lord Mayor of Dublin, Hayes, who was his brother-in-law, worked for him as secretary. He evidently regarded this watercolour as one of his finest and in 1888, a highly-finished watercolour entitled *Sackville Street, Twenty-Five Years Ago*, was shown at the Irish Exhibition in London—that painting is likely the version now in the National Gallery of Ireland. The present painting appears to be an earlier work by Hayes, and is full of the incidental detail he observed in the busy street, including a man in the foreground holding a sign, "Summer Goods - McSwiney Delaney & Co'. The pavements are crowded with people, dressed in the latest fashions, the men in top hats and the women wearing crinoline dresses. Horse-drawn omnibuses, carriages, jaunting cars and drays traverse the cobblestones. The painting is an important record of Dublin's main thoroughfare in the mid-nineteenth century; today Nelson's Pillar is no longer there, while Clery's Department Store was destroyed in 1916 and rebuilt six years later. While it closed its doors in recent years, there are plans to renovate the building as offices and a hotel.

Born in Waterford in 1820, Michael Angelo Hayes was given his first

lessons in art by his father Edward Hayes (1797-1864), a portrait and equestrian painter. Around 1831, the family moved to Dublin, and having begun to exhibit at the Royal Hibernian Academy, aged seventeen, Hayes went on to specialise in equestrian and military subjects. He is perhaps best known for his illustrations *Car-Driving in the South of Ireland in the Year 1836* which were published as aquatint prints by Ackerman. He painted many scenes of horse racing and hunting, including *The Race for the Corinthian Cup at Punchestown (1854)*. In 1842 he was appointed "Military Painter-in-ordinary" to the Lord Lieutenant, and painted a watercolour of troops parading at Dublin Castle. He also depicted the Yorkshire Hussars in 1840, and *The Charge of the 3rd King's Own Light Dragoons at Moodkee*, an engagement in 1845 during the First Sikh War. In 1846 he painted *16th Lancers Breaking the Square at Aliwal* and nine years later, *The Heavy Cavalry Charge at Balaklava*. Hayes's paintings were based on direct observation and he made a detailed study of equestrian anatomy, writing a paper in 1876 entitled *The Delineation of Animals in Rapid Motion*. He also painted early animations, called 'phenakistoscopes' of people dancing. In the late 1840's Hayes was in London, where he became an Associate Member of the New Society of Painters in Water Colour. However most of his career was spent in Dublin; he became a member of the RHA in 1854, and was elected Secretary two years later, when George Petrie was President. The two men quarrelled and over the years following the Academy's activities were marred by bitter disputes. Many of Hayes's works were published as engravings and lithographs, including a series illustrating the ballad "Savourneen Deelish" (his sweet love). He died in 1877, having fallen into a water tank on the roof of his house and drowned.

Earl Wandesford's Claim, c. 1765

Co. Cork Lands: *M/ss., 7 large foolscap pages listing in great detail the property in Cork city held by Eponetus Cross, who died in 1702, and mentions more vaguely his "large estate" in the county.* The descent of the property is then given in equal detail, the principal beneficiaries being his granddaughter Susannah, wife of George Wandesford, Viscount Castlecomer, and grandson William Wallis. Lady Castlecomer left Cork when very young and lived in England. On finding out that she was entitled to a share of the property in Cork, she employed "a Person" to collect her rents, but she was only allowed to receive whatever William Wallis was prepared to give her. On her death (1757), her son John (created Earl Wandesford in 1758) claimed the missing bits and the arrears of rent, but on coming over to Cork he found that the property had greatly deteriorated.

With William Wallis now dead, as is his only son "the late" Barachias Wallis (died 1765), so Wandesford claims his share of the property from William's daughters, Helena (the wife of John Colthurst) and Clotilda (a minor, through her uncle and guardian Robert Fitzgerald Uniacke). The notary tasked with drawing up the case is enjoined to "make the Bill full strong as the nature of the Case will require so as that we may have satisfactory answers from all parties". Co. Carlow: *1752- The Examination of Michael McGrath, a Cotter, of Kilconnor, Carlow dated 16th April 1752.*

McGrath states he met William Ling of Cruttenclough, Kilkenny at "the fayre of Clonegal". Ling had one black springing cow marked on her hind quarter with the letter B and one dark brown heifer for sale. McGrath bought the cow and Edward Clowry of Shangarry, Carlow bought the heifer. McGrath believed the cow was not honestly come by as it had been sold too cheap.

William Ling produced a voucher from Miles McDaniel of Crossnee, Queen's County who vouched and gave his hand for the honesty of the cow. On the 3rd of April 1752 McGrath had the cow grazing at Kilconnor when Daniel Whelan, James Whelan, Michael Fitzgerald and several others from Kilkenny came and drove the cow away, claiming it was the "property of Daniel Whelan and stole from him". With Jury return finding Ling and McDaniel guilty of stealing the cow. (1)

Relating to Lands in Co. Kerry, 1762

Manuscript: Large document on Vellum, in English, 3 membranes. Royal portrait at top left corner; across the top a scroll of vine leaves with an English rose and a Scottish thistle. Seal of the Irish Court of Common Pleas (intact). Prior to 1834 it was illegal for the owner of an entailed estate to sell any part of his lands. Lawyers, however, found some ingenious methods of evading this restriction, one of which was a fictitious lawsuit in which the owner was said to "suffer a common recovery". An "exemplification of common recovery" was generally an impressive (and no doubt expensive) document – large, written on vellum in an ornate script, headed with the royal portrait and national emblems, and bearing the large seal of the relevant court. The legal phraseology was often extremely complicated, but so formulaic that it was seldom written out in full.

In this case, the owners were Richard and Francis Chute of Tullygarran and the prospective purchasers were the Hon. William Crosbie of Ardfert and Stephen Mills of Cork, banker. The lands are named as Tullygarran, Ballygakin alias Ballygakee, Ballyard, and Clogherclinin alias Clogherclemin, in the barony of Traughanackmee. A large impressive document, as a m/ss., w.a.f. (1)

D'Esterre (Henry) An aggrieved tenant's case against his landlord, 1810, Set of four documents (printed and MS) concerning an appeal made to the House of Lords against two judgements by the High Court of Chancery in Ireland, William Wheeler, gent. appellant, Henry D'Esterre esq., respondent:

- (1) The respondent's case.
- (2) Another copy of same.
- (3) An additional appendix to the appellant's case.
- (4) Copy bond of appellant dated 10 March 1810 to pay respondent's costs if he loses the appeal.

In 1782 D'Esterre had granted Wheeler, who was then his steward, 200 acres in Rosmanaher, Co Clare, with the inducement that "if he behaved himself properly" and married with D'Esterre's consent, he would grant him a lease for lives. On account of Wheeler's subsequent misconduct, he later withdrew this undertaking, and began ejectment proceedings in 1793. In defence of his claim to the property, Wheeler submitted evidence that D'Esterre had made a definite promise to grant him a lease, and pointed out that he had carried out considerable improvements to the property, erecting a new house and building embankments against flooding from the Shannon. His case was rejected by the High Court of Chancery in two decrees of 1803 and 1808.

Now (1810) Wheeler is taking his case to the House of Lords. The mills of the law grind slow indeed! As a m/ss., w.a.f. (4)

The Beresford Letters

Politics in Waterford & Londonderry in the Wake of Catholic Emancipation 1829-1833

Beresford, Viscount (General Sir William Carr). An Archive of approx. 70 Letters, 6 July 1829 - 21 Sept. 1833 (but mainly 1829-1830) on political affairs in Waterford and Londonderry, written to the Kerry solicitor Pierce Mahony, mostly by Viscount Beresford (General Sir William Carr Beresford, natural son of the first Marquis of Waterford), with some by his half-brother General Lord George Beresford.

In the general election of 1826, Lord George had lost his seat in Waterford County to the pro-Emancipation candidate, Henry Villiers-Stuart. However, the passing of the Emancipation Act in April 1829 caused a realignment of forces: Villiers-Stuart, job done, resigned his seat; Mahony, alienated by O'Connell's campaign for the repeal of the Act of Union, allied himself with the Beresford faction - hence these letters.

In the ensuing by-election (March 1830), Lord George regained his seat, easily defeating his O'Connellite rival, John Barron. Then, three months later, the King's death precipitated a general election, in which Lord George and Daniel O'Connell won the two seats for Waterford County. Lord George again stood in the general election of May 1831, but, finding that his support had evaporated owing to his opposition to some provisions of the Reform Bill, withdrew at the last minute.

The letters provide a fascinating insight into the attitudes of the Beresford faction towards their political allies and rivals, their political manoeuvrings, and their fond "hope we are now a united people, and that the political distinction between Protestant and R. Catholic is at an end. I trust it will be so in society, as politically".

The letters also deal with affairs in the Beresfords' other home turf, the county and borough of Londonderry, and their rift with the sitting MPs, George Dawson and Sir George Hill.

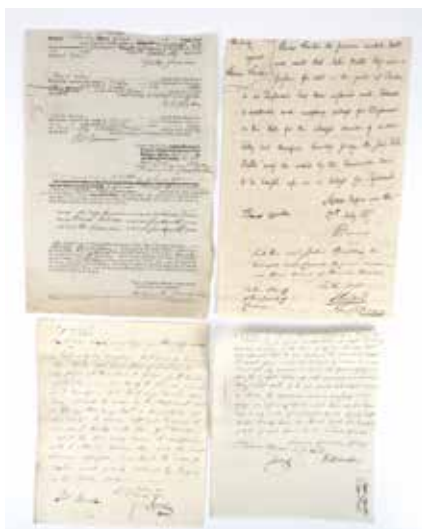

Chamberlain died in May, 1802. Appeal by Thomas Byrne signed by Lord Kilwarden (Arthur Wolfe of Naas) in August 1801. Kilwarden was Lord Chief Justice of Ireland in 1803 when he was piked to death on Thomas Street, Dublin in July 1803 after being dragged from his coach by supporters of Robert Emmet. It was rumoured at the time that he was the father of Wolfe Tone. Deposition from Reverend Thomas Brooke signed in March 1815 by Lord Norbury (infamously known as The Hanging Judge). The deposition relates to the trial of John Hickey for the murder of Thomas Brennan. Norbury's most famous trial was when he acted as judge at the trial of Robert Emmet in 1803. He continually abused Emmet throughout the trial before sentencing him to be hanged, drawn and quartered. Document referring to alleged murder of Andrew Kelly signed in July 1807 by Judge William Lord Downes who was appointed Lord Chief Justice of the King's Bench to replace Lord Kilwarden after his murder in 1803. Following his death in 1826 Downes was buried, at his own request, in the same tomb in St Anne's Church, Dublin as the aforementioned Judge Tankerville Chamberlain, his inseparable friend for many years.. 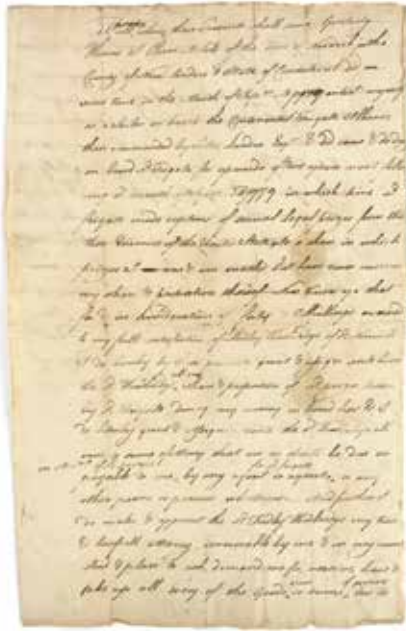
All the items in this collection are by A.A. Luce, and most are partly or fully in Luce's own hand. Most of the items were sent to David Berman, who was Luce's last student. These mostly consists of letters and, postcards relating to Berman's Ph.D thesis, as it progressed over the years, from 1966 to 1972, also on letters on an article they, (with Prof. J.-P. Pittion) were working on together, which was published in 1969, and on articles Luce himself was working on. All together there are about one hundred items, hence probably the biggest collection in either public or private hands. (TCD has a surprisingly small collection of Luce material.)

Luce is generally regarded as the great Berkeley scholar of the 20th Century. For he wrote the authoritative biography of Berkeley, he also edited with T.E. Jessop, the nine-volume edition of Berkeley's works, and edited the Diplomatic Edition of Berkeley Philosophical Notebooks. In addition he published on other subjects, such as fishing, chess and the Book of Kells. Luce was much more than just a scholar. He was an important figure in the history of TCD, especially in the 1930s and 1940s, when he was at the forefront of the governance of the College, fighting hard and passionately to preserve the Trinity identity which he knew from 1901 to 1914, ie. before WWI, the Easter Rising and Civil War. Luce was an important figure in the Church of Ireland, the other great institution in Ireland, which like TCD, could not be easily assimilated into the new post 1922 Irish State. Among the most interesting items in the collection is a nine-page type written article, entitled 'Berkeley's Theory of Vision and the 'Parts' of his Principles.' Luce sent this to Berman with a covering letter dated 13 October 1971, asking him what he thinks of it.

Another item is the article on Berkeley which Luce was asked to do for the Encyclopaedia Britannica, which he did, but which they decided to abridge. Luce was so angered by this, that he refused to sign his name to the abridged version which was published. The two-page typed written item is the un-abridged version.

Another item is a one-page hand-written account about whether Berkeley wrote the 1737 novel, 'The Adventures of Gaudentia di Lucca,' which has often been attributed to Berkeley. The item is Signed by Luce and dated 2-12-1932. Luce concludes his account by saying that 'the author [of the novel] is able, well-informed and philosophical.' But Luce says, he doubts if Berkeley 'would write so sustained a romance.'

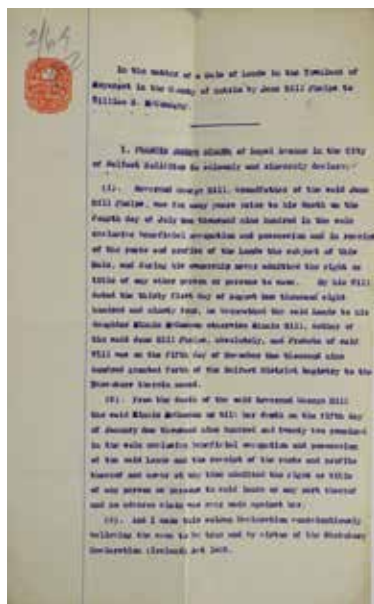

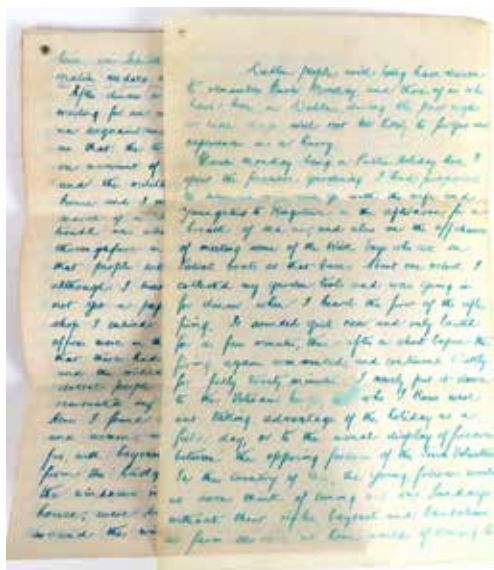

Eye-Witness Account of 1916 Easter Rising

Manuscript: Steven (Capt. George)

A 20 page handwritten eyewitness account of the 1916 Rising in Dublin, by Captain George Steven, Inspector of Fisheries. Steven cycled around Dublin City throughout the Rising watching the fighting in different quarters. his account of Monday April 24 includes a description of "Sinn Feiners" inside St. Stephen's Green shooting dead an unarmed drunken man "of the labouring class" who had removed a trunk from a barricade. On Tuesday he witnessed the Fire Brigade attending a fire in Dunn's on Sackville Street and describes how an urchin raised barbed wire "on a pike" to allow the engine through and despite heavy firing on the street, the "firemen were not interfered with." "Early Wednesday morning our Fisheries Cruiser "Helga," now a formidable gun boat, slipped up the Liffey and threw a few shells under Butt Bridge right into Liberty Hall." 'The Men are Sleeping'

Important 1916 Documents. A very interesting and important file of documents with provenance to G.A. Newsom, manager of the Jacob's Factory in Dublin, occupied by insurgents commanded by Thomas MacDonagh during Easter Week 1916, as follows:

* A printed document headed 'NOTICE / [three fleurons] / *Please make no noise / as the men are sleeping*', on plain white poster-type paper circa 10½ ins x 10 ins, inscribed rear in a contemporary hand, 'Printed by the I.R.A. / in Jacob's Factory; & hung up there / during the Rebellion 1916. When / they took the Factory: Fold marks, frayed at one edge, no loss, a little print offsetting. To our knowledge unrecorded, probably A UNIQUE SURVIVAL from those dramatic days in April 1916.

* Surrender Order. A contemporary manuscript copy of Pearse's Surrender Order headed 'H.Q. Moore St' and subscribed 'P.H. Pearse / Commandant General / Commanding in Chief / the Army of the Irish Republic', dated 29 April 1916, in an unknown hand, not Pearse's. The text, beginning 'Believing that the glorious stand ./. matches copies signed by Pearse for distribution to outlying units (one of at least three different versions of the surrender order). Written on the rear of a blank W.& R. Jacob memo form, evidently broadly contemporary.

* Typescript (carbon copy) account by P. Barry, a Jacob's employee, dated 14th May 1916, headed 'COPY / To Mr G.A. Newsom, Director', 1 pp, with ms. annotations adding names, on rear of a Jacob's continuation sheet, describing how he went to the factory about 3.30 on Sunday April 30th, having heard of the surrender, 'surprised and amazed to find Bishop Street full of Looters .. with armfuls of tins of biscuits .. others carrying away ten stone bags of flour .. It was disgraceful .. we entered and found the Volunteers ready to leave, I addressed the Commander and told him we were employees of the firm and wished to stop the looting. He readily agreed and told us to pass along and take two rifles with us. We found about 50 looters coming from the lofts, we made them drop their loot .. (They asked for mercy and not to shoot them) .. hearing the clergy were in the house I invoked their aid. I found Father Aloysius [sic] .. and Father Monaghan .. They got out on the window sill and addressed the crowd with determination and said they should be flogged bringing ruin and disgrace on this country.'

A fascinating account, evidently authentic. Part (only) is quoted in W&R Jacob: *Celebrating 150 Years of Irish Biscuit Making*, by Séamas Ó Maitiú (Woodfield Press, 2001).

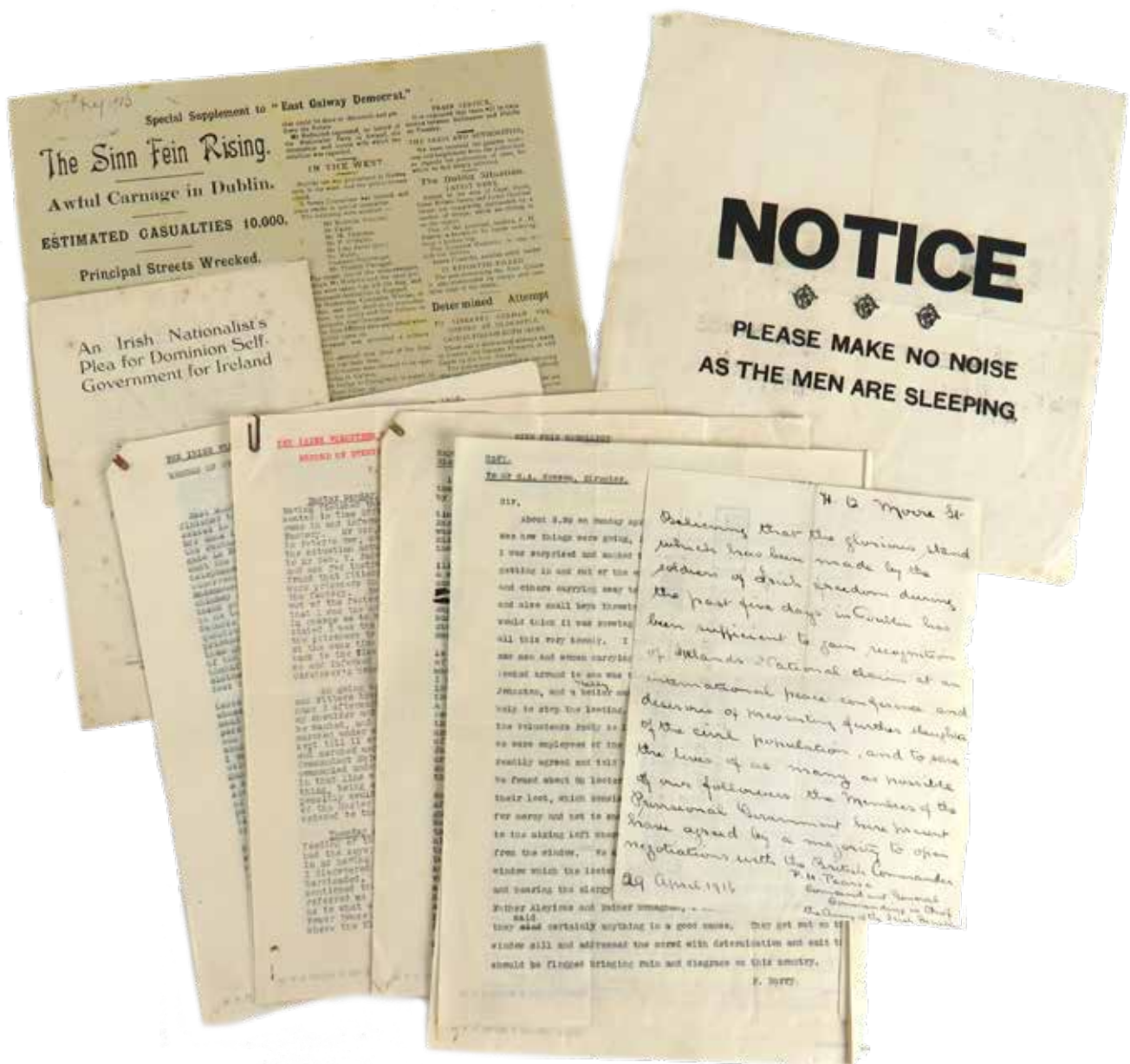
* Typescript (carbon copy), 2pp, on rear of Jacob's continuation sheets, 'Account given by Mr P. Cushen of his experience at the Biscuit Factory at the time of the surrender of the Rebels on April 30th 1916'. Again a fascinating contemporary account, 'ran down about 3 p.m. and saw about 90 of them getting out of the windows and a lot of the rabble getting in up the rope that was hanging from the office window, and tumbling the sacks of flour out .. got in to the Bakehouse and was surprised to see between 90 and 100 of the rebels standing and sitting around .. One of the officers of the rebels came in .. said there was a lot of bombs stored away that would blow up the whole place .. showed me where there were some hand grenades stored .. left me on guard of them and told me on peril of my life not to let anyone lay a hand on them until the Military came in that

knew what they were. He then went away after making himself known to me, I found myself introduced to Major McBride, for the first and last time .. Just then the [British] soldiers came in, ordered me at the point of the bayonet to take down 'that d— rebel flag', which he did, etc., with more detail about the looting, Frs. Aloysius and Monaghan etc., saw Major McBride marshalling the rebels in the Bakehouse and forming them into ranks. McBride was called 'General' by the rebels and was the only Commander P. Cushen was aware of.

Again an important, detailed and patently authentic contemporary account. Part (only) is quoted by Séamas Ó Maitiú (see above).

* Sinn Fein Rebellion. Experiences of a prisoner [Thomas Orr] in Messrs. W. & R. Jacob & Co's Biscuit Factory, from Easter Monday April 24th to Sunday 30th '16. 3pp typescript, carbon copy, on rear of Jacobs' continuation sheets. Part of 3 lines indelibly obscured. Describes how the rebels told him to leave with the other workers, but he refused to do so as he was acting as Caretaker, '& no matter what was to be the result, I would not leave (which they afterwards admired me for)' He was detained with four other prisoners, and describes how he asked the rebel commander to prevent all smoking in the factory, which he agreed, and to allow them to attend to the company's horses, which caused problems as the rebels did not wish to have their barricades pulled down to give them access. 'Everything seemed to be victory up to Wednesday evening', but on Thursday their demeanour seemed to change, 'for you could see by the officers that all things were not going on satisfactorily outside' .. on Friday, 'the man in command of the Volunteers – McDonagh – went out and held consultations .. with the result that an unconditional surrender .. read aloud to the men on Sunday at 2.30 which came as a great surprise to many: some burst into tears .. During the whole time of occupation I never saw any of them under the influence of drink or using language not suitable .. but for the sudden collapse & the influence brought to bear on them by the clergy, it would have been a difficult matter to remove them from the factory.' Part (only) is quoted by Séamas Ó Maitiú (see above).

* The Irish Volunteer Rising, Easter Monday, April 24th 1916. Record of events as known to Henry Fitzgerald, Watchman. Typescript, top copy, 4 pp, on rear of Jacob's continuation sheets, with a second copy of same (different typing, carbon copy), apparently identical. 'I was marched under escort to Lieut. Colbert. There were also present Commandant McDonagh, Major McBride, & Captain Hunter. I was commanded under threat to show where foodstuffs & any other necessities in that line were stored. Needless to state, I did not show everything, being anxious to save as much of the Firm's property as I possibly could .. At 3 o'clock P.M. I was escorted to the Commandant, and questioned as to my name, religion & also address. Having answered these questions, I was asked to allow myself to be sworn in as a member of the Sinn Fein Volunteers. I stated that I was never a member of any organisation, political or otherwise, & that all I wanted was to be released & allowed to go home to my wife & children. This answer seemed to cause disappointment & I was then told to consider myself still a prisoner & to be kept under close arrest .. Wednesday, April 26th .. At 11 o'clock p.m. the Fire Alarm bell started ringing .. when it came to four minutes, I suggested to



Mr. Orr that something was wrong .. Taking into consideration the immense quantity of flour which would be destroyed [by the sprinkler system], I decided to offer my services to cut the water off & effect repairs. Commandant McDonagh, Major McBride, Captain Hunter & Lieut. Colbert escorted me to No. 5 Sprinkler installation, where I turned the water off. They then requested me to explain the working of the Sprinkler system. I demurred .. asked a second time, I gave a partial idea of the working of the system., I may here state that they had a plumber to make any repairs that might be required' -- and so on, with more about the care of the Company's horses, continuing in detail to the surrender and withdrawal. Part (only) is quoted by Séamas Ó Maitiú (see above).

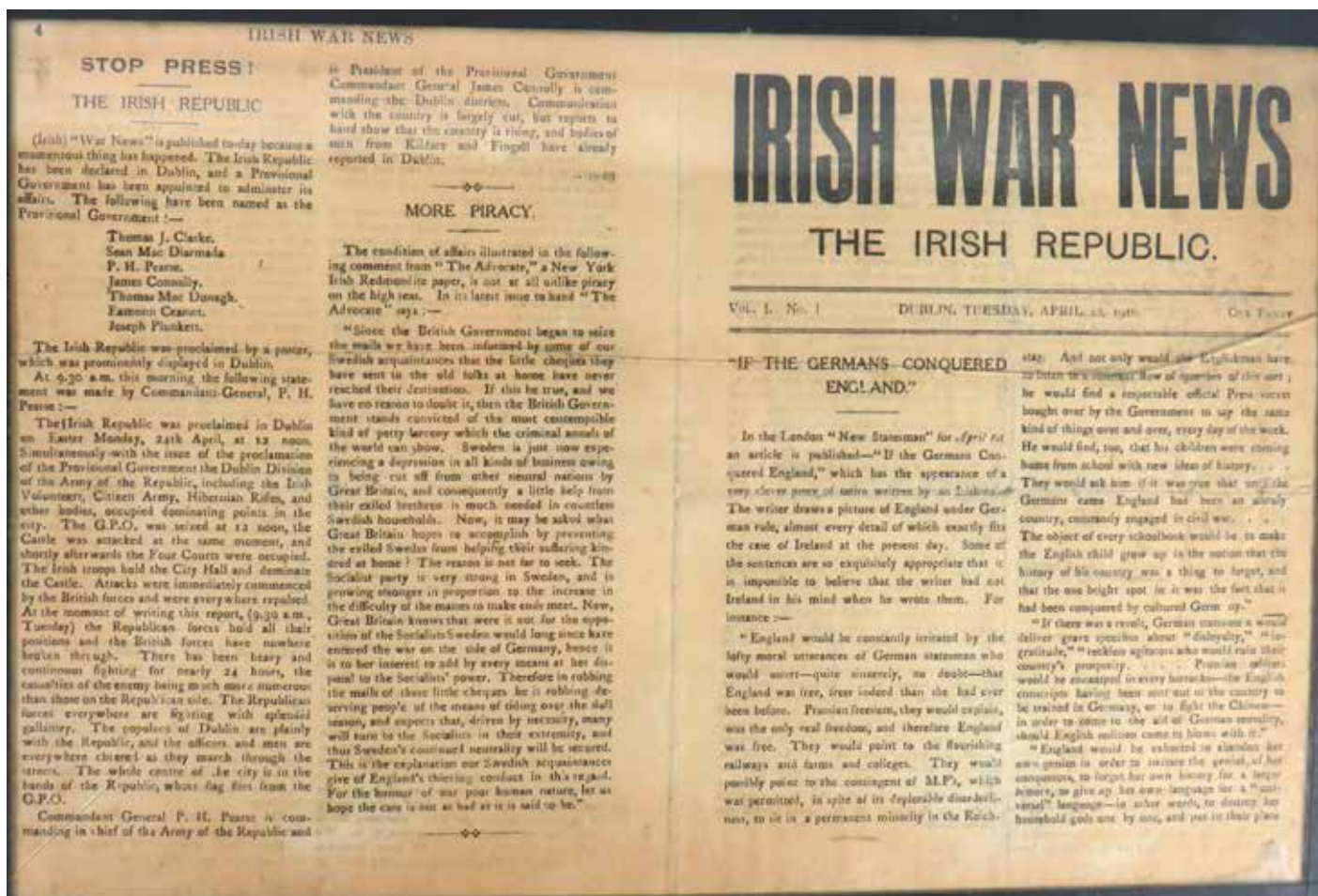

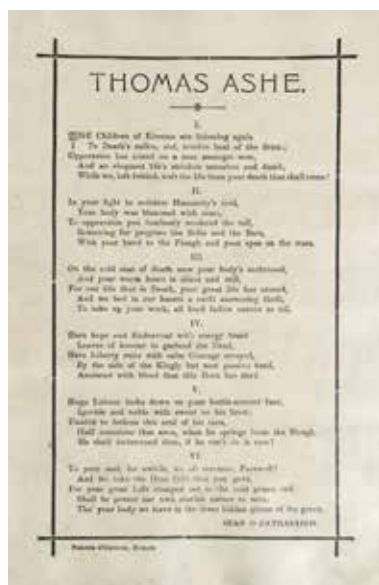
Irish War News. The Irish Republic

Vol. 1 No. 1, Dublin Tuesday April 25 1916 [second day of the Rising]. Sm. quarto, single folded sheet. A superlative copy, easily the best to have come on the market in recent years, in immaculate condition throughout apart from a few finger marks.

A very scarce item, the only publication known to have been printed in the area controlled by the rebels during the Rising, in a commandeered print works in Halston Street. The material in pages 1-3 may have been prepared in advance, but the 'Stop Press' column on page 4, headed 'The Irish Republic', could not have been written before Tuesday morning as stated. Written by Pearse while under fire in the GPO, it names the members of the Provisional Government, and gives some details (mainly accurate) of the fighting to date. 'At the moment of writing this report (9.30am, Tuesday) the Republican forces hold all their positions and the British forces have nowhere broken through. There has been heavy and continuous fighting for nearly 24 hours, the casualties of the enemy being much more numerous than those on the Republican side. The Republican forces everywhere are fighting with splendid gallantry.'

It is printed on the lightest of newsprint, and surviving copies are often in poor condition, torn, frayed or soiled; the present copy is altogether exceptional.

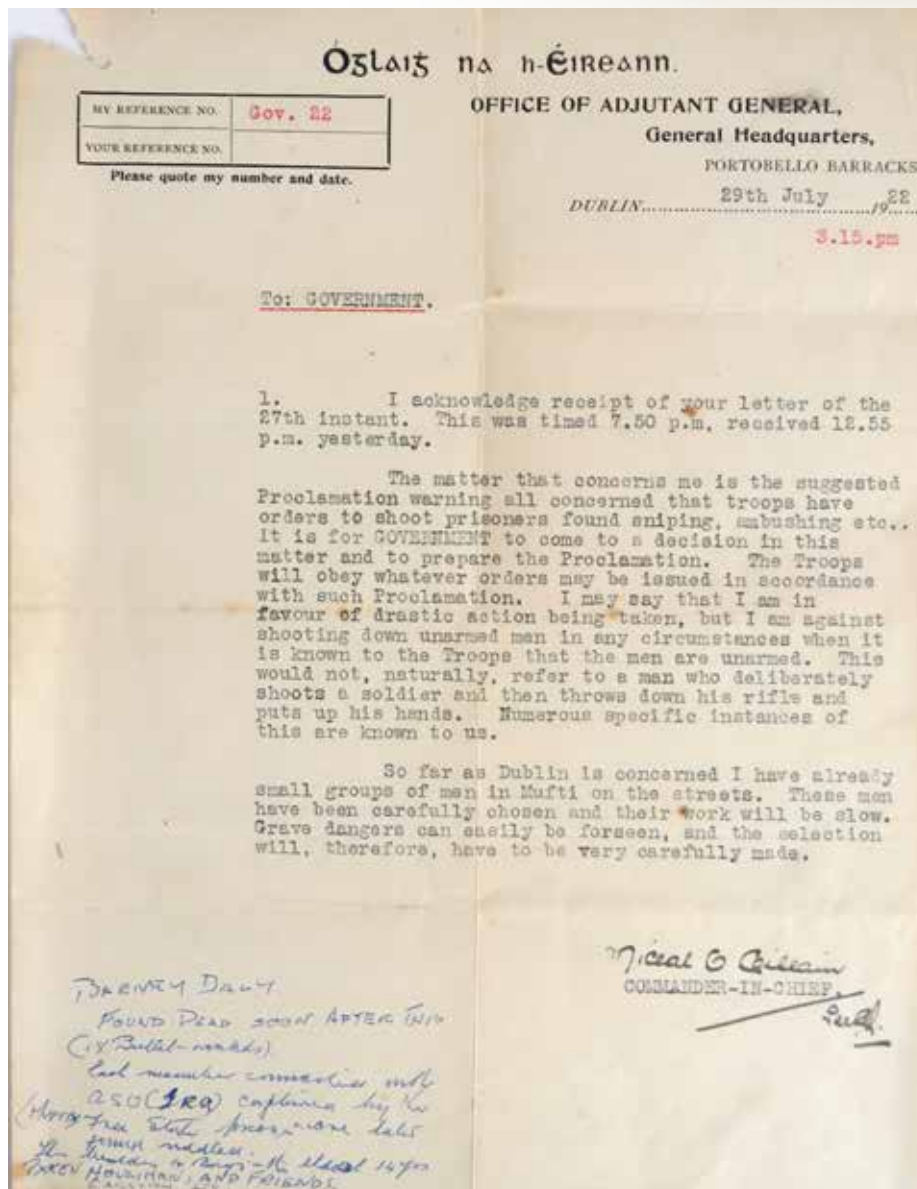

The remainder of the document is taken up with his alleged confession, which states that he had discussions with Dr. James Ryan, Minister for Agriculture, [Garda] Chief Superintendent Martin Lynch and others about IRA plans and activities. It claims that Dr. Ryan incited the IRA to carry out the arms raid on the Magazine Fort, so that the Government could move against certain Irish Army officers whom it wished to remove, that he encouraged the IRA to raid banks for funds, and much else.

* Hayes escaped from IRA custody and issued his own account of these events (published in full in 'The Bell'), alleging that his 'confession' was secured by torture. The truth of the whole affair was never fully cleared up, but it seems likely that there was some contact between Hayes and Dr. Ryan and others, in the general context of divisions within the IRA about Sean Russell's bombing campaign in England. This IRA statement was suppressed and is rare. (1)

'I am against shooting down unarmed men'

COLLINS, Michael. An important TL, unpublished and apparently unrecorded, 29 July 1922, addressed to GOVERNMENT, responding to a 'suggested Proclamation warning all concerned that troops have orders to shoot prisoners found sniping, ambushing etc.' 1 pp, on headed notepaper of Óglaigh na hÉireann, Office of Adjutant General, GHQ, Portobello Barracks, signed in a secretarial hand Micheal Ó Coileáin, Commander-In-Chief. Later inscription in blue ink bottom left, small tear top left where apparently torn from a file, no loss.

A most important statement of Collins' views on a crucial issue, just over three weeks before his death in a roadside ambush. 'It is for Government to come to a decision .. The Troops will obey whatever orders may be issued .. I may say that I am in favour of drastic action being taken, but I am against shooting down unarmed men in any circumstances where it is known to the Troops that the men are unarmed. This would not, naturally, refer to a man who deliberately shoots a soldier and then throws down his rifle and puts up his hands.'

Collins goes on to say, 'So far as Dublin is concerned I have already small groups of men in Mufti on the streets. These men have been carefully chosen and their work will be slow. Grave dangers can easily be foreseen [sic], and the selection will, therefore, have to be

very carefully made.'

The letter does not bear Collins' signature, but in our view there is no doubt of its authenticity. It was apparently drafted in response to a letter from President Cosgrave in connection with the suggested Proclamation, itself a response to earlier letters from Collins. See Coogan, 'Michael Collins', p. 394; Hart, 'Mick: The Real Michael Collins', p. 404. Neither of these works quotes the present Collins letter, and it appears to be unrecorded.

It is possible that Collins had second thoughts, and decided not to send the letter; but in our view it is more likely that the letter was sent but not delivered, or was later removed from the file. Postal deliveries were frequently raided around this time. The later inscription refers to the death of Barney Daly, 'found dead soon after this (18 bullet wounds)', etc., probably an Irregular. This indicates that at some point the letter was in the hands of persons sympathetic to the Irregulars, and it is most likely in our view that this letter was intercepted in the post and never delivered.

It is in any case a clear and important statement of Collins' views on a crucial issue, literally a matter of life and death, a few weeks before his own death.

Provenance: Joe Kelly (O'Kelly) Ballaghaderreen, Adjutant of 4th Battalion East Mayo Brigade (which incorporated several companies in West Roscommon), a member of the Irish Republican Brotherhood. O'Kelly and Alec McCabe stole a car out of a garage in Ballaghaderreen Easter Monday night and headed toward Tubbercurry in Sligo in order to muster men and gather them together for show of force. The attempt proved futile as they had gotten only a few miles out of town when the car broke down. Seeing headlights on the road and assuming it was British transport, the two parted company, each making his way to his own home turf. O'Kelly was arrested after the Rising for his Sinn Féin sympathies and sent to Her Majesty's Prison at Lewes on the 20th of May. He was later sent to "The Irish University", Frongoch. As part of Lloyd George's appeal to American sympathies (he needed their support in World War I), Kelly was released seven months after arrest.

It was a decision the Crown was soon to regret. In 1917 O'Kelly was again arrested after his return from County Longford,

where he had helped with the Joe McGuinness election. While walking down the street in Ballaghaderreen, two Constables grabbed him and announced they were taking him to the barracks. He drew his pistol and in the ensuing scuffle, the two policemen were shot---although not seriously. Joe was sent to Dublin for trial and from thence to Dundalk where, at the time, hunger strikes were taking place. After three weeks on hunger strike, Joe was released and returned "back to his old post as secretary of the Sinn Féin Club and Volunteer organiser."

Joe sailed across the Irish Sea and became active as a gun-runner in Liverpool: purchasing, storing and shipping arms to Ireland. He also participated in the burning of the Liverpool docks on 28 November 1920. Kelly took the Anti-Treaty side during the Civil War and was arrested near Ballaghaderreen by troops under Alec McCabe on 25 August 1922. He was taken to Sligo gaol from which he escaped in mid-October. In late October he was named O/C of the Flying Column because Seamus Mulrennan had been killed. His leadership was short-lived. He was recaptured at Markree Castle on 14 November 1922. Four decades later he was elected chairman of the Commemorative Committee that erected the monumental Elphin IRA statue. Kelly died in 1966

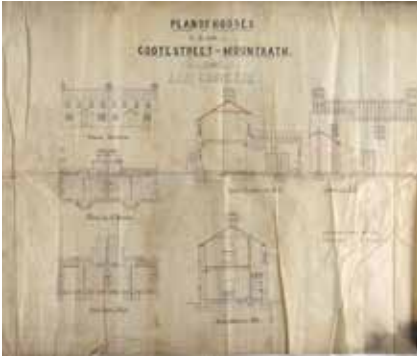

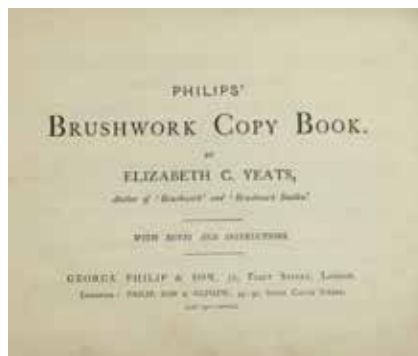

Emily Adelaide Wynne (1872-1958) Irish textile artist at Avoca Woollen Mills, was born in Germany in 1872. Her parents were Albert Augustus Wynne, a civil and mining engineer, and Alice Katherine (nee Wynne). She was the eldest of five children, with three sisters, Winifred Frances (1873-1969), and Alice Clara 'Veronica' (1890-1969), and two brothers John Brian (1877-1977) known as Jack and Charles (1895-1917). The Wynne family were originally from Hazelwood or Annagh, County Sligo, and were related to Dr. Kathleen Lynn and Constance Markievicz. Their family home was the Georgian Tigroney House, beside the Avoca Woollen Mills in the village of Avoca, County Wicklow. Along with his brother, Wyndham, their father held mining interests in Germany, with the family frequently visiting the country.

Following the collapse in value of their mining investments, the Wynne brothers pulled out of German mining in 1908, and refocused on local Irish projects. This focused Wynne's mother on her daughters' need to develop a vocation to support themselves, encouraging them in intellectual and creative pursuits.

The Wynne sisters were most likely educated at home by governesses. Frances trained in designing patterns for damask work from around December 1901 to March 1902 at Andrew S. Robinson Designing Rooms, Wellington Place, Belfast. Having attempted to sell her designs to some

Belfast linen mills, she learnt the practical and economic realities of creating a design suitable for production. Wynne, her sisters and her mother ran a lace repair and sales business from around 1905 to 1916, to supplement the family's income. Wynne ran the business again after World War I using her contacts in Europe. Both of Wynne's brothers fought in the war, with Charles dying in France from injuries he sustained. Wynne also wrote a novel with her sister Alice Clara Veronica, *"Every Dog"* (1929), published under the pseudonyms E. and B. Pringle-West.

The sisters took over the running of the Avoca Woollen Mills in 1927, which was originally founded in 1723. The mill became known for its strong and unusual colours, which at the outset are reported to have been by accident. The Wynne's capitalised on this reputation, using unusual colours in their cloth with new lines, which proved a success overseas. The mill was soon supplying fabrics to fashion designers in France and woollen items to the United States. Wynne developed her own signature pink, along with other colour derived from her botanical knowledge allowing her to source and grow plants in their large walled garden for dyes. She became known for cultivating primulas including one named "Julius Caesar".

The Avoca Woollen Mills products were sold through the Country Shop on 23 St. Stephen's Green, Dublin, and supplied tweed to the designer Elsa Schiaparelli. Wynne visited Schiaparelli in Paris in 1933 and 1937. She also made a trip to New York and Boston in 1935 with the American agent Carol Brown. They opened a shop in London in the 1930s, overseen by Wynne's cousin, Barbara Donovan, acting as the mill's English agent. The company was at its peak in the 1940s, employing 70 men and producing 500 yards of cloth a week. Papers, diaries and other archival material from Wynne and her sisters are held in the Manuscript collection of the Library of Trinity College, Dublin. As an Album, w.a.f.

Note: The artist chosen was James Edward Kelly (1855 – 1933), a New Yorker of Irish descent, who grew up during the Civil War. It was this upbringing, perhaps, that caused Kelly to develop a lifelong interest in American history—indeed the subjects of his sculpture and illustrations are often people and events of American military history. The connection with Wilde continued when, as the Complete Works [1] reminds us, "Kelly was commissioned to provide five full-page designs and nine tailpieces for Rennel Rodd's *Rose Leaf and Apple Leaf* (1882), to which Wilde contributed an introduction".

The drawing depicts Wilde, later famous for his children's stories, seated in profile perhaps as storyteller, alongside an unidentified child. It is often speculated that the boy was Kelly's son, but Matthew Sturgis in his biography *Oscar Wilde* (UK Edition: p. 778, n. 44) points out that Kelly had no son.

Kelly used the head of Wilde from this image as the basis for an etching made to reproduce advertising media during 1882; and he also sculpted a similar clay bas-relief from which a bronze plaque was made. The image has since appeared in various guises, including in Wilde biographies €1500 - €2000

A lock of Wilde's Hair, presented by his son Vyvyan Holland to the distinguished Irish actor Mícheál MacLiammóir after the first London performance in 1960 of MacLiammóir's pioneering one-man show 'The Importance of Being Oscar', compiled by him from Wilde's writings.

Among those present on the first night was Vyvyan Holland, then aged 74. He came backstage after the performance, said he had been deeply moved, and presented MacLiammóir with a lock of his father's hair [the present item].

message in MacLiammóir's hand to performers in a late 1970s Gate Theatre production, 'Love and prayers for triumph for you all from morbid bedridden jealous MacLiammóir', with a pencilled message on rear complaining about lack of advance publicity for the production. Possibly his last message to the theatre he loved so well.

Mícheál Mac Liammóir and Hilton Edwards were for many years Ireland's best-known gay couple, at a time when active homosexuality was a breach of the law. They observed the proprieties, and were received at all levels of Irish society.

MacLiammóir apparently was born in England in 1899 as Alfred Willmore, to an Irish mother. An actor from childhood, and a member of the London Gaelic League, he came to Ireland about 1927 and became henceforth Mícheál MacLiammóir. He toured with Anew McMaster, whose wife was MacLiammóir's sister Marjorie, and met another English actor, Hilton Edwards. They shared similar ideas on life and theatre, and launched the Dublin Gate Theatre together in 1928, bringing 'a great sense of style and a demanding professionalism to each production' (Boylan, Dict. I. Biog.). They had many successes and honours, in Ireland and abroad, and were made freemen of Dublin in 1973.

In 1960, MacLiammóir's one-man performance on the life and works of Oscar Wilde was one of the earliest essays in that genre. The first performance in Dublin was very warmly reviewed; Michael Redgrave, reading the reviews in London, phoned to arrange a West End transfer: hence the present item.

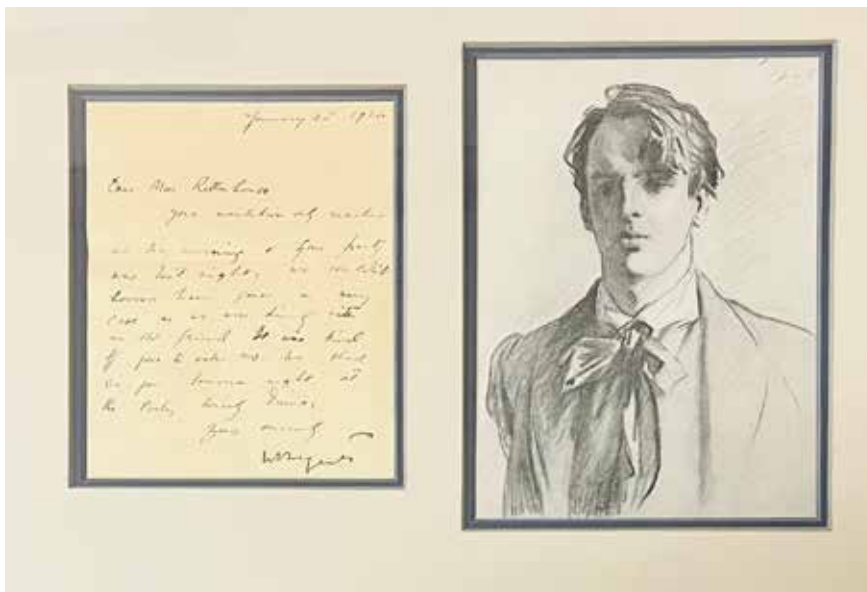
MacLiammóir continued to act for a further 17 years. He became seriously ill in 1977, and died in 1978. Edwards died in 1982. €5,000 - €7,000

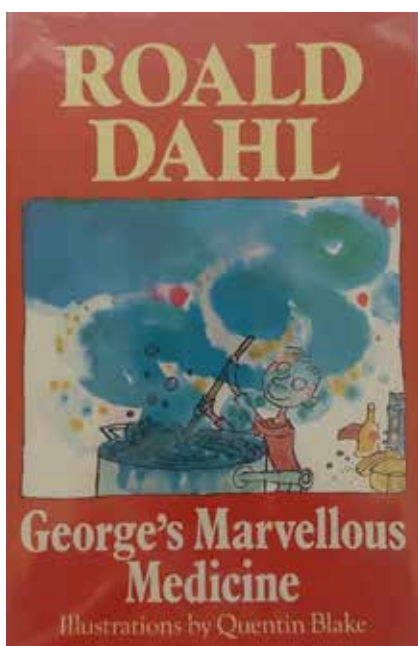
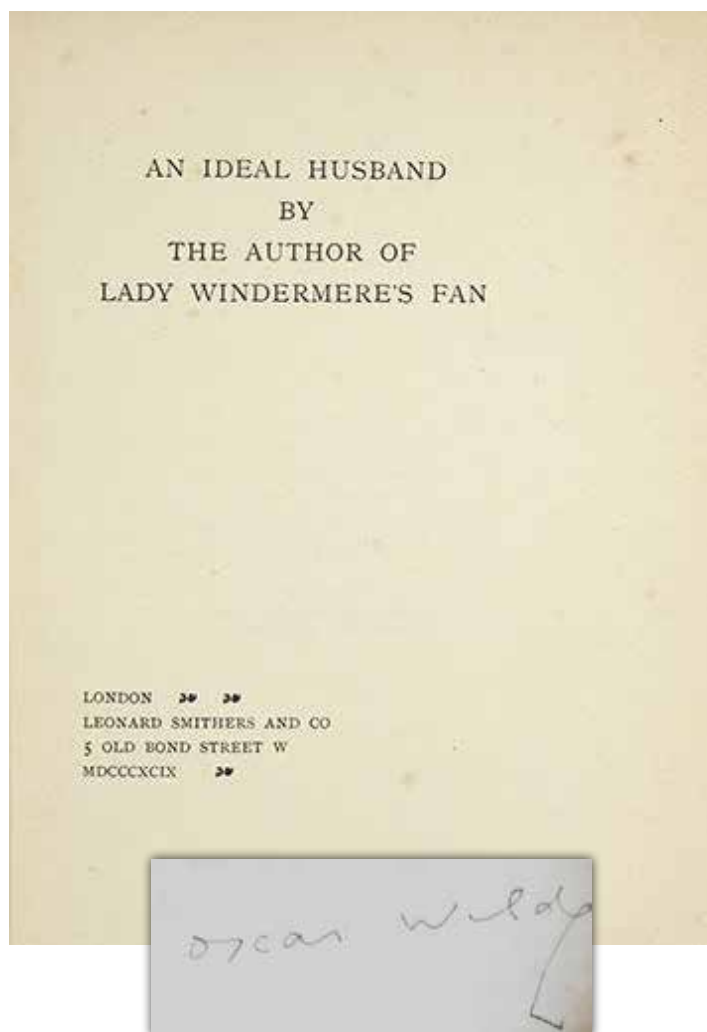
Oscar Wilde, '9 Charles St., Grosvenor Sqre., London.'

This address, 9 Charles Street (now named Carlow Place) off Grosvenor Square in Mayfair, was the principal London residence of Wilde until his marriage to Constance Lloyd in 1884, soon after which he and his wife set up home in Tite Street, Chelsea.

Inspired by a story heard by his friend Frank Harris while in Egypt and subsequently told to Wilde, who dedicated the published play to him the action revolves around blackmail and political corruption, and touches on the themes of public and private honour. The play opened on January 3rd, 1895, at the Theatre Royal Haymarket, to a standing ovation from the Prince of Wales and prominent members of the British Government, and continued for 124 performances. That very same establishment would soon turn its back on Wilde after his fall from grace in April of that year (Ellmann: Oscar Wilde, p. 411).

The play remained unpublished until after Wilde's release from prison. The published version differs slightly from the performed play. Wilde added many passages and cut others, prominent additions included written stage directions and character descriptions.

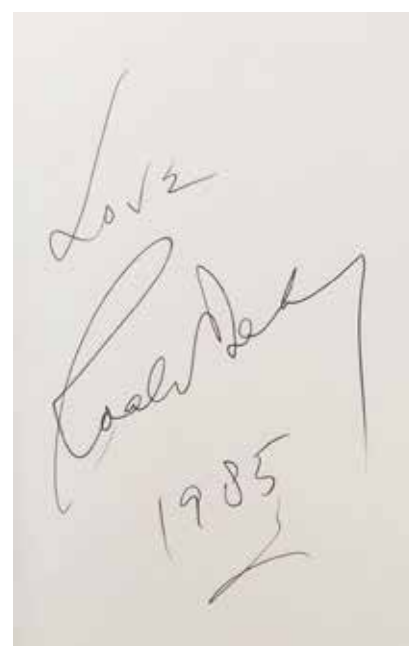

Ex. Libris: Fr. Thomas Bonnet, O.P. (1825-1895) a noted Dominican scholar who lived in Marseilles, with his book label. The Title also bears two small oval stamps of the Dominican mother - house in Rome. (1)

* Thomas Burke was born in Dublin in 1709/10 and sent to Rome in 1724 to study for the priesthood with the Dominican order. After ordination he taught in S. Clement's in Rome and met distinguished scholars and cardinals of the Curia, including the papal nephew Cardinal Neri Corsini, Secretary of State and patron of the architect Allesandro Galilei, the builder of the façade of St. John Laterano in Rome (and also responsible for the design of Castletown House).

Fr. Burke was commissioned to write the history of the Dominican Order after he returned to Ireland in 1743 and worked in the Dominican House in Dublin. In 1759 he was appointed Catholic Bishop of Ossory, no doubt his advancement was helped by his connections with the Roman Curia. Interestingly the Protestant Bishop of Ossory at the time was the famous traveller and writer, Richard Pococke (1756-1765) with whom Burke developed friendly relations.

Bishop Burke's book *Hibernia Dominicana* came out in 1762 and dedicated to Cardinal Neri Corsini, but the imprint was given to the Cologne printing house of Metternich, while it is now generally accepted that it was actually printed in Ireland. The use of a fictitious imprint was occasionally resorted to because of fear of the Penal Laws. However the only harm to Burke came, not from the government, but from his fellow Irish Bishops when they ordered that certain pages from *Hibernia Dominicana* be ripped out because of the perceived offence they caused, thus ensuring the book's lasting fame.

Some time after the book's appearance the author sent fifty copies to Rome for sale and presentation to colleagues and friends. A small number were specially bound up in the Vatican bindery for presentation to high ranking cardinals in the Curia, including the dedication copy to Nerio Corsini, the Papal Nephew and "Protector of Ireland." About four or five copies survive in *de luxe* bindings of which the present copy is the only one in a private collection.

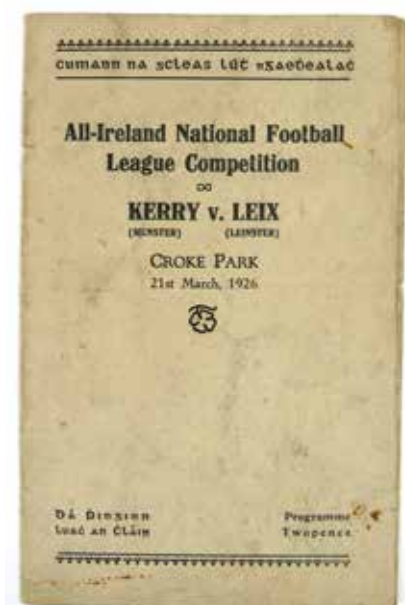
Bloody Sunday, 1920**A Dark Day in GAA & Irish History**

'Bloody Sunday' An original Admission Ticket to Croke Park, Great Challenge Match (Football), Tipperary v. Dublin, Sunday, November 21, 1920. Pink card, 3 ins x 4 ¼ ins, overall good condition, minor creasing.

It was at this match that British soldiers opened fire on the pitch and crowd, killing a player and twelve spectators. This followed Michael Collins' operation against British secret service agents earlier that morning, in which fourteen British officers were shot dead. The period 1918 - 1920 was a turbulent and dangerous period in Irish History. Martial Law was enforced in many areas, and the activities of the G.A.A. and other Sporting Organisations were severely curtailed. The behaviour of the British Forces in Ireland forced many young men to join the Irish Volunteers, and other Republican Organizations despite having no background in the movement. Especially in Tipperary, many young men of the time, and particularly those involved in Gaelic Games joined in the struggle for Irish Independence. With such exciting events as the Rescue of Sean Hogan at Knocklong Railway Station in May 1919, several of the country's leading Footballers became involved in the War of Independence. By early March 1920 the number of Gaelic Games played almost came to a standstill. This trend continued into the early summer when normally the volume of activity should have been increasing. In October there came a sudden and brief revival of Inter-County Fixtures. However, the following month was to have a tragic outcome. In early October, approximately five thousand spectators who had so far that year had little exciting fare were entertained by a rousing Challenge Football Match in Croke Park, between Dublin and Kildare, which Dublin won. Soon afterwards, the Tipperary County Board issued a challenge to Dublin. A match was arranged for 2.45 p.m. on Sunday November 21st, again at Croke Park. The game was well organised, and advertised as The G.A.A. Challenge Match. It was intended that the money raised from the match would help the Association for the Dependents of the I.R.A. who had been killed or imprisoned. The events which occurred at that game, now known as "Bloody Sunday," followed the early morning assassination of eleven British Intelligence Agents, "The Cairo Gang," in an operation organized by Michael Collins. When the British retaliated later that day, it was to Croke Park that the Military and Auxiliary Forces came, recognizing that the Stadium was the centre and symbol of Irish Nationalism and Nationalistic Aspirations. "Then suddenly and without any warning, Croke Park was the scene of a holocaust??" They fired into the crowd indiscriminately, killing twelve people and wounding about sixty, "On the field Michael Hogan, one of the Tipperary backs (and one of only two Irish Volunteer Officers on the Tipperary Team) lay mortally wounded, while within seconds a dozen spectators were dead or dying, many more seriously wounded."

This was Bloody Sunday. Nothing more strikingly illustrates the close connections between the G.A.A. and the Republican Movement between 1916 and 1922, than "Bloody Sunday"; together with a Photograph of Frank Mc Partland, wearing his medals. (2)

Portrait of Archbishop Thomas G. Croke 1824-1902. O.O.C., 92cms x 76cms (36" x 30") (1)

Set against a grey background, Archbishop Thomas William Croke is depicted dressed in clerical 'choir dress'— a black wool cassock, trimmed with purple silk. Grey-haired, his expression is severe but not unkindly. The identity of the artist is not known, but this portrait probably dates from the 1880's, when Croke was Archbishop of Cashel and Emly.

Born in Castletcor, near Kanturk in County Cork, Thomas William Croke was the son of William Croke, agent for the Freeman Estate, and Isabella Plummer. Although William was Catholic, his wife Plummer was Protestant, a descendant of the Knights of Glin, and in 1817 when she married Croke, her parents disowned her. When William died, his brother Thomas took on responsibility for educating the couple's eight children. Three of the boys entered the priesthood, while two of the girls became nuns. After attending school at Charleville, Thomas William went

to Paris to further his studies, and then to the Irish College in Rome, where he was awarded a Doctorate of Divinity. In 1847 he was ordained at Cloyne, Co. Cork, and shortly afterwards was appointed a professor at Carlow College. Eleven years later Croke was made President of St. Colman's College in Fermoy, and he also served as parish priest of Doneraile. He attended the First Vatican Council in 1870 and that same year was appointed Catholic Bishop of Auckland in New Zealand. Four years later Croke was back in Ireland, serving as Archbishop of Cashel and Emly, and becoming an ardent supporter of the Irish Nationalist movement. However, he was summoned to Rome to be given a dressing-down for his support for Charles Stewart Parnell, and thereafter became less directly involved in politics. He died at the Archbishop's Palace at Thurles in 1902. A keen supporter of the Gaelic Athletic Association from the outset, Croke Park is named after him.

Fonsie Mealys, hereinafter called “the auctioneer” exercises all reasonable care to ensure that all descriptions are reliable and accurate, and that each item is genuine unless the contrary is indicated. However, the descriptions are not intended to be, are not and are not to be taken to be, statements of fact or representations of fact in relation to the lot. They are statements of the opinion of the auctioneers, and attention is particularly drawn to clause 5 set out below. Comments and opinions, which may be found in or on lots as labels, notes, lists, catalogue prices, or any other means of expression, do not constitute part of lot descriptions and are not to be taken as such unless they are made or specifically verified by the auctioneers.

Clause 1

- (a) Each lot is put up subject to any reserve price imposed by the vendor
- (b) Subject to sub-clause (a) of this clause, the highest bidder for each lot shall be the purchaser thereof
- (c) If any dispute arises as to the highest bidder the auctioneer shall have absolute discretion to determine the dispute and may put up again and resell the lot in respect of which the dispute arises.

Clause 2

- (a) The bidding and advances shall be regulated by and at the absolute discretion of the auctioneer and he shall have the right to refuse any bid or bids. NOTE: Where an agent bids, even on behalf of a disclosed client, the auctioneer nevertheless has the right at his discretion to refuse any such bid.
- (b) The purchaser of each lot shall immediately on its sale, if required by the auctioneer, give him the name and address of the purchaser and pay to the auctioneer at his discretion the whole or part of the purchase money. If the purchaser of any lot fails to comply with any such requirement the auctioneer may put up again and re-sell the lot; if upon such re-sale a lower price is obtained than was obtained on the first sale the purchaser in default on the first sale shall make good the difference in price and expenses of re-sale which shall become a debt due from him.
- (c) Where an agent purchases on behalf of an undisclosed client such agent shall be personally liable for payment of the purchase money to the auctioneer and for safe delivery of the lot to the said client.

Clause 3

- (a) The auctioneer reserves the rights to bid on behalf of clients including vendors, but shall not be liable for errors or omissions in executing instructions to bid.
- (b) The auctioneer reserves the rights, before or during a sale, to group together lots belonging to the same vendor, to split up and to withdraw any lot or lots at the auctioneer's absolute discretion and without giving any reason in any case.
- (c) The auctioneer acts as agent only, and therefore shall not be liable for any default of the purchaser or vendor.

Clause 4

- (a) Each lot shall be at the purchaser's risk from the fall of the hammer and shall be paid for in full before delivery and taken away at his expense within one day of the sale. The buyer will be responsible for all removal, storage and insurance charges in respect of any lot which has not been collected within one day of the date of sale.
- (b) If any purchaser fails to pay in full for any lot within 21 days of the date of sale such lot may at any time thereafter at the auctioneer's discretion be put up for sale by auction again or sold privately; if upon such re-sale a lower price is obtained than was obtained on the first sale the purchaser in default on the first sale shall make good the difference in price and the expenses of re-sale which shall become debt due from him.
- (c) Interest at 2 per cent per month and legal costs (if any) for recovery of monies due shall be payable by the purchaser on any overdue account.

Clause 5

- (a) All lots are made available for inspection before each sale and each buyer, by making a bid, acknowledges that he has satisfied himself as to the physical condition, age and catalogue

description of each lot (including but not restricted to whether the lot is damaged or has been repaired or restored).

(b) All lots are sold with all faults and imperfections and errors of description and the Auctioneer and its employees, servants or agents shall not be responsible for any error of description or for the condition or authenticity of any lot, save for Clause 5 (c) below. Written or verbal condition reports may be supplied by the Auctioneer on request but these are merely statements of opinion, and any error or omission in these reports may not be taken as grounds for a cancellation of sale or refund of any part of the purchase price or the cost of any repairs to the lot or lots reported on

(c) A purchaser shall be at liberty to reject any lot if he - (i) gives the auctioneer written notice of intention to question the genuineness of the lot within seven days from the date of sale; AND (ii) proves that the lot is a deliberate forgery and (iii) returns to the auctioneer within 20 days from the date of sale the lot in the same condition as it was at the time of sale; provided that the auctioneer may, at his discretion, on receiving a request in writing from the purchaser, extend for a reasonable period the time for return of the lot to enable it to be submitted to expertisation. NOTE: The onus of proving a lot to be a deliberate forgery is on the purchaser.

(d) Where a lot has been submitted to expertisation, all costs of such expertisation shall be paid by the person who retains the certificate of expertisation and item or items to which the certificate relates.

(e) Where the purchaser of a lot discharges the onus and acts in accordance with sub-clause (b) of this clause, the auctioneer shall rescind the sale and repay to the purchaser the purchase money paid by him in respect of the lot.

(f) No lot shall be rejected if, subsequent to the sale, it has been marked by an expert committee or treated by any other process unless the auctioneer's permission to subject the lot to such treatment has first been obtained in writing.

(g) Any lot listed as a “collection, range, portfolio etc.” or stated to comprise or contain a collection or range of items which are not described shall be put up for sale not subject to rejection and shall be taken by the purchaser with all (if

any) faults, lack of genuineness and errors of description and numbers of items in the lot, and the purchaser shall have no right to reject the lot; except that, notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this sub-clause, where before a sale a person intending to bid at the sale gives notice in writing to, and satisfies the auctioneer that any such lot contains any item or items undescribed in the sale catalogue and that person specifically describes that item or those items in that notice, then that item or those items shall, as between the auctioneer and that person, to be taken to form part of the description of the lot. Clause 6 The respective rights and obligations of the parties shall be governed and interpreted by Irish law, and the buyer hereby submits to the exclusive jurisdiction of the Irish Courts.

Clause 6

The respective rights and obligations of the parties shall be governed and interpreted by Irish law and the buyer hereby submits to the exclusive jurisdiction of the Courts of the Republic of Ireland.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

a) The buyer shall pay the Auctioneer a commission at the rate of 25% of the purchase price (which includes VAT at the prevailing rate under The Margin Scheme and which is not reclaimable).

(b) The Auctioneer or its employees, servants or agents may, on request organise packing and shipping of lots purchased or may order on the buyer's behalf third parties to pack or ship purchases. Under no circumstances does the Auctioneer accept any liability whatsoever for any loss or damage howsoever occasioned in the course of such service.

(c) The buyer authorises the Auctioneer to use any photographs or illustrations of any lot purchased for any or all purposes as the Auctioneer may require. The placing of a bid will be taken as full agreement to all the above conditions.
