

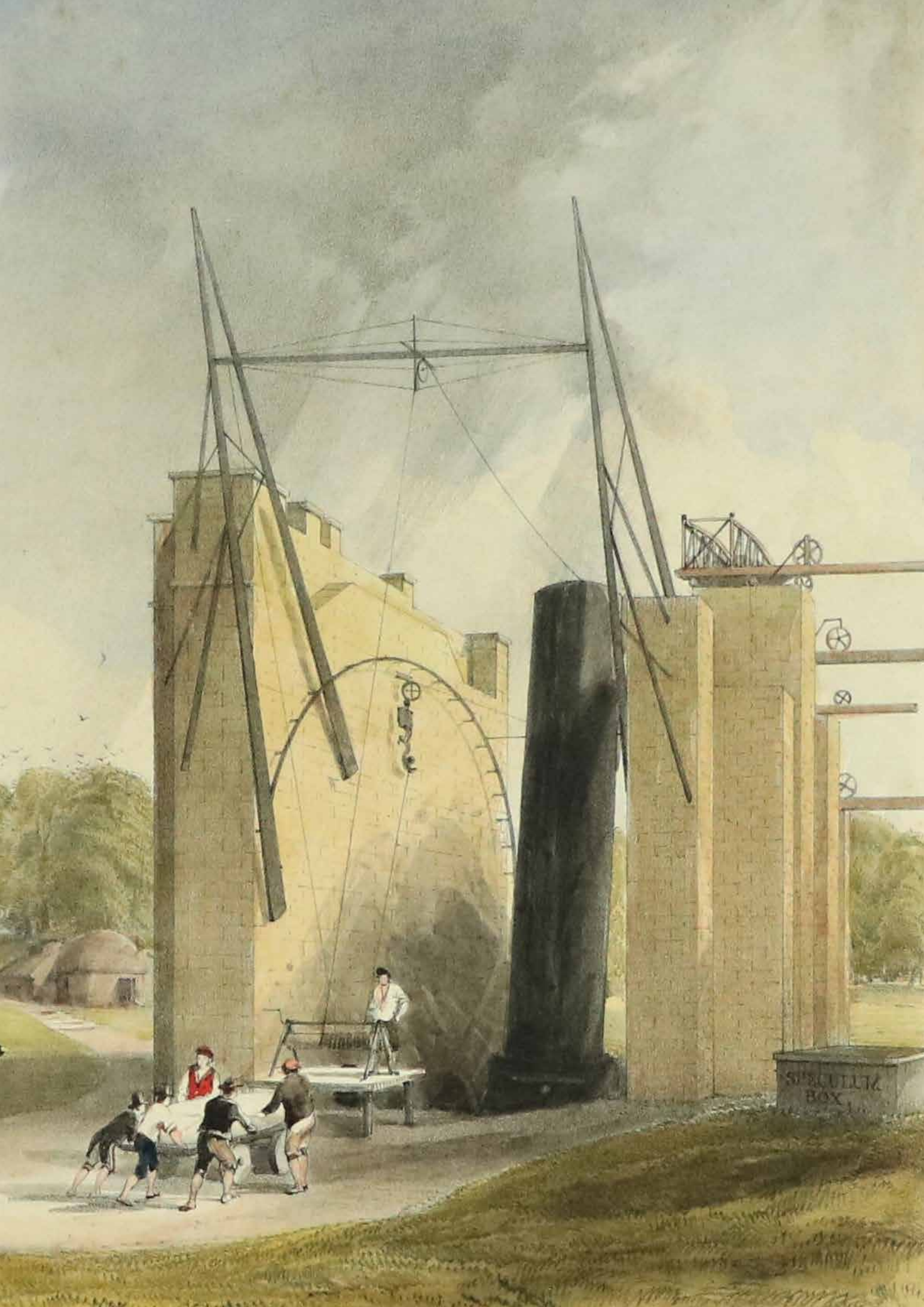

ARTIST'S RESALE RIGHTS (DROIT DE SUITE)

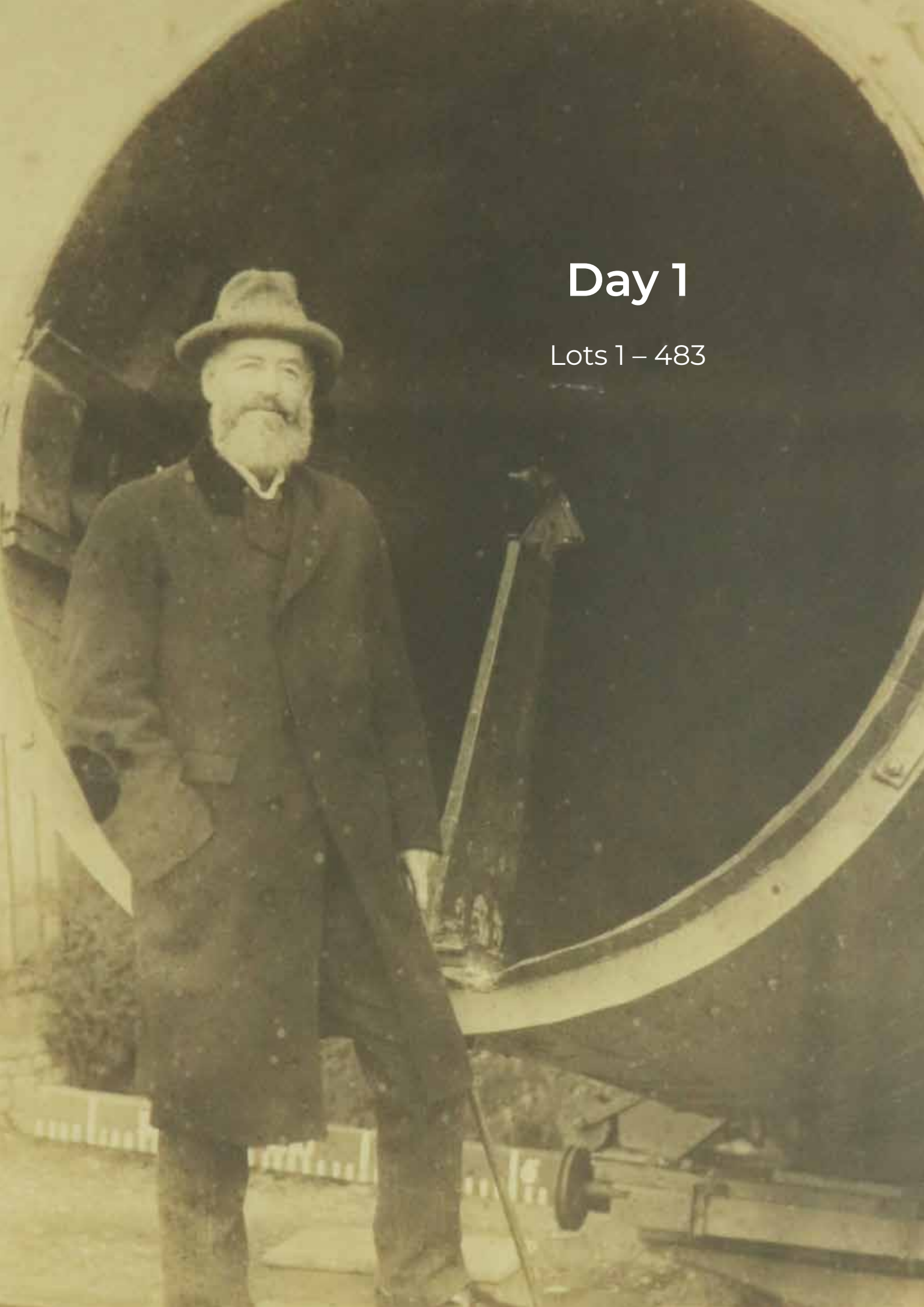
The resale royalty payable is calculated as follows:

From €350,000.01 to €500,000	0.5%
Exceeding €500,000	0.25%

The total amount of royalty payable on any individual sale shall not exceed €12,500.

The seller is liable for payment of this royalty on completion of the sale. The artist may request from the Auctioneer any information necessary to secure payment.

Sir William Young [1749-1815] 2nd Baronet, F.S.A., was a British Diplomat, Colonial Governor, Politician, of Delaford Manor House, near Uxbridge, England. His Father, Sir William Young, [1725-1788], 1st Baronet, was also a Politician, Sugar Planter and Slave Owner. This family is the subject of the famous painting by Zoffany, entitled "Sir William Young and his Family", c.1767.

The 1st Baronet served as President of the Commission for the Sale of Lands in the Ceded Islands, and was the first non-military Governor of Dominica in 1768. He was the author of "An Historical, Statistical and Descriptive Account of the island of Tobago"

On the death of his Father, the 1st Baronet, the younger Sir William Young, now 2nd Baronet, inherited four plantations in the West Indies, one in Antigua, two in Saint Vincent, and another on Tobago. He benefited greatly from the slave trade, and owned 896 enslaved Africans at the time of his inheritance. In 1791, he embarked on a tour of his estates in the Caribbean, surveying the land, gaining information on conditions of those he enslaved and the sugar industry in the region. He published his findings in 1801, under the title "A Tour through the several Islands of Barbados, St. Vincent, Tobago and Grenada in the years 1791 and 1792"

He was appointed Governor of Tobago in 1807, a post he held until his death. He had been entrusted to supply an in-depth report, on condition, treatment of slaves, etc. etc. At the time of the report, the free population of Tobago was calculated to be 959, with a militia of 333 men, while the number of enslaved people on the island was estimated at 16,671. His book contains many watercolours, maps, clippings and descriptions of the plantations on the island.

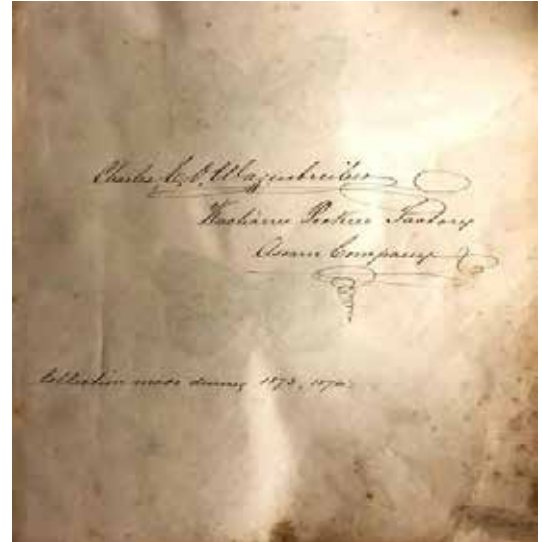

Prior to 1834 it was illegal for the owner of an entailed estate to sell any part of his lands. Lawyers, however, found some ingenious methods of evading this restriction, one of which was a fictitious lawsuit in which the owner was said to "suffer a common recovery". An "exemplification of common recovery" was generally an impressive (and no doubt expensive) document – large, written on vellum in an ornate script, headed with the Royal portrait and national emblems, and bearing the large seal of the relevant court. The legal phraseology was often extremely complicated, but so formulaic that it was seldom written out in full.

In this case, the owners were Richard and Francis Chute of Tullygarran and the prospective purchasers were the Hon.



William Crosbie of Ardfert and Stephen Mills of Cork, banker. The lands are named as Tullygarran, Ballygakin alias Ballygakee, Ballyard, and Clogherclinin alias Clogherclemin, in the barony of Traughanackmee.

By the end of the 18th century, reports showed that conditions in the schools were appalling, and they were eventually discontinued on the recommendations of a Government Commission of Enquiry of 1825.

An Irish Officer's Diary, May-October 1790

The writer, whose identity has so far proved elusive, was an officer in a British regiment and came from Ennis, Co. Clare (see entries for 6-13 October). He continues to Kilkenny, Waterford again, Carrick-on-Suir, Clonmel, Cashel, Limerick, Cork, Mallow, and finally home to Ennis. He spends a great deal of time visiting and socialising. Each day he records, not only what he did but who he was with, and how he spent his evenings. There are frequent lapses into German with cryptic references to letters (all numbered) to and from "meine liebste", delivered via his uncle. Many names are mentioned, and he has caustic comments to make about some people and places - of Castletown in Co. Kilkenny he writes (25 July): "Mr Cox's place a very handsome one, the House a superb one for this Country, but everything about the House most dirtily kept. N.B. The Stables Coach Houses are too near the House a great Error"; and of John O'Brien (Limerick, 12 September): "I find him what I always expected him to be, a damned good for nothing cringing scoundrel." An indefatigable campaigner for the abolition of the slave trade, he was killed in battle against the Ashanti (his skull was used as a drinking-cup by the Ashanti rulers). Charles MacCarthy junior, then aged twelve, was adopted by his uncle, the Comte Charles François Fontaine de Mervé, who had married Sir Charles's sister. €220 - €320

The material covers four generations of the family, ending with the eldest brother of the first Viscount Gough, and fleshes out the rather sketchy pedigree of the family given in Burke's Peerage.

The collection also provides much information on the Going family of Ballyphilip and their lands in Tipperary. It also includes some material relating to the family of Frend, who had genealogical links with both families, while the Cobdens were connected to the Goughs through the marriage of George Edward Cobden of Raheen with Georgina Gough.

Contents includes watercolours of: The Family; Arthur Augustus Wynne parting from his beloved Slasher; Last Minutes at Avoca Station; Friends at Waterloo Station; Southampton Water, Isle of Wight, Last View of English Coast, Portuguese Coast; Mouth of the Tagus; Flock of Lambs, Tangiers, Arab Costumes; In the Native Town; J.B. Wynne as Lace Connoisseur shopping for Alice Katherine Wynne; The Party in desperate straits, befriended by Signore Romanelli; Consumption of Pasta, Signora Scappini; The Signorine Giannini, etc.

Emily Adelaide Wynne (1872-1958) Irish textile artist at Avoca Woollen Mills, was born in Germany in 1872. Her parents were Albert Augustus Wynne, a civil and mining engineer, and Alice Katherine (nee Wynne). She was the eldest of five children, with three sisters, Winifred Frances (1873-1969), and Alice Clara 'Veronica' (1890-1969), and two brothers John Brian (1877-1977) known as Jack and Charles (1895-1917). The Wynne family were originally from Hazelwood or Annagh, County Sligo, and were related to Dr. Kathleen Lynn and Constance Markievicz. Their family home was the Georgian Tigroney House, beside the Avoca Woollen Mills in the village of Avoca, County Wicklow. Along with his brother, Wyndham, their father held mining interests in Germany, with the family frequently visiting the country.

Following the collapse in value of their mining investments, the Wynne brothers pulled out of German mining in 1908, and refocused on local Irish projects. This focused Wynne's mother on her daughters' need to develop a vocation to support themselves, encouraging them in intellectual and creative pursuits.

The Wynne sisters were most likely educated at home by governesses. Frances trained in designing patterns for damask work from around December 1901 to March 1902 at Andrew S. Robinson Designing Rooms, Wellington Place, Belfast. Having attempted to sell her designs to some Belfast linen mills, she learnt the practical and economic realities of creating a design suitable for production. Wynne, her sisters



and her mother ran a lace repair and sales business from around 1905 to 1916, to supplement the family's income. Wynne ran the business again after World War I using her contacts in Europe. Both of Wynne's brothers fought in the war, with Charles dying in France from injuries he sustained. Wynne also wrote a novel with her sister Alice Clara Veronica, "Every Dog" (1929), published under the pseudonyms E. and B. Pringle-West.

The sisters took over the running of the Avoca Woollen Mills in 1927, which was originally founded in 1723. The mill became known for its strong and unusual colours, which at the outset are reported to have been by accident. The Wynne capitalised on this reputation, using unusual colours in their cloth with new lines, which proved a success overseas. The mill was soon supplying fabrics to fashion designers in France and woollen items to the United States. Wynne developed her own signature pink, along with other colour derived from her botanical knowledge allowing her to source and grow plants in their large walled garden for dyes. She became known for cultivating primulas including one named "Julius Caesar".

The Avoca Woollen Mills products were sold through the Country Shop on 23 St. Stephen's Green, Dublin, and supplied tweed to the designer Elsa Schiaparelli. Wynne visited Schiaparelli in Paris in 1933 and 1937. She also made a trip to New York and Boston in 1935 with the American agent Carol Brown. They opened a shop in London in the 1930s, overseen by Wynne's cousin, Barbara Donovan, acting as the mill's English agent. The company was at its peak in the 1940s, employing 70 men and producing 500 yards of cloth a week. Papers, diaries and other archival material from Wynne and her sisters are held in the Manuscript collection of the Library of Trinity College, Dublin. As an Album, w.a.f. 'My Spirit is the Same'

O'Malley (Ernie), *Republican*. A remarkable ALS, 2 pp (single sheet), from Kilmainham Prison, 26/11/1923, to 'Dear K' (evidently a Republican comrade), asking for books to be sent to him, 'Here I am again on the flat of my back as the [hunger] strike terminated on 23/11. I believe I will never be strong again, and may pull round somewhat in time, but what's the odds. My spirit is the same whatever about the body, and after all that's the main thing. My sight is bad and I nearly kicked it several times but I had not the luck to die.'

He expects he will not be released before Easter, and in the meantime he needs reading material, particularly literature and art books. He gives a long list of writers and painters, starting with Shakespeare and Botticelli, and says he can send £5, and perhaps 'some of the enthusiasts out there' may do something for him. 'I have work to do for Ireland yet, and can be educating myself as best I can with what books I can lay my hands on'. He says 'Frank [Aiken] is still at the helm, and thank God for that. He understands the Northern question and will pay due

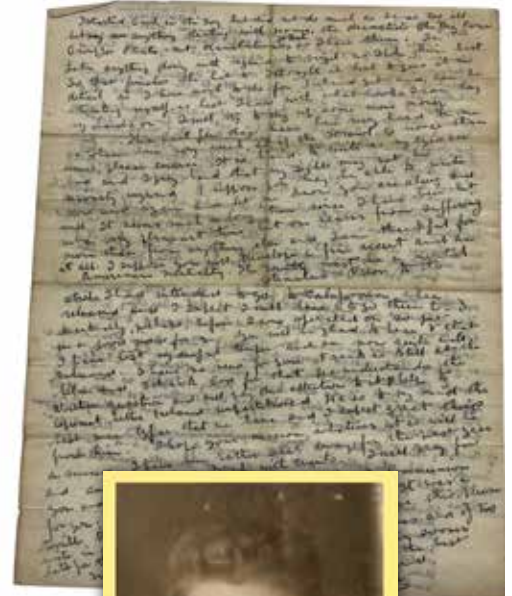
attention to it & help to represent a better Ireland unpartitioned. He is to my mind the best man by far that we have & I expect great things from him.'

He wishes 'K' success with his or her mission, which apparently is in America. 'I will pray for you and for your success and will offer up Communion for you; unfortunately I get it only once a week. It was a terrible trial to be so long without it .. Ever your friend, Ernie.'

Ernie O'Malley was very seriously wounded in November 1922, while resisting capture in a Dublin 'safe house'. At that time he was assistant chief of staff of the Anti-Treaty IRA. He spent five months in a prison hospital, and then went on a forty-day hunger strike. He was released on medical advice in 1924. He partly recovered his health, and went to Spain and the United States, where he wrote the classic, 'On Another Man's Wound'.

A fine revealing letter, which well captures the man, his spirit and his courage. Letters from O'Malley are very uncommon. (1)

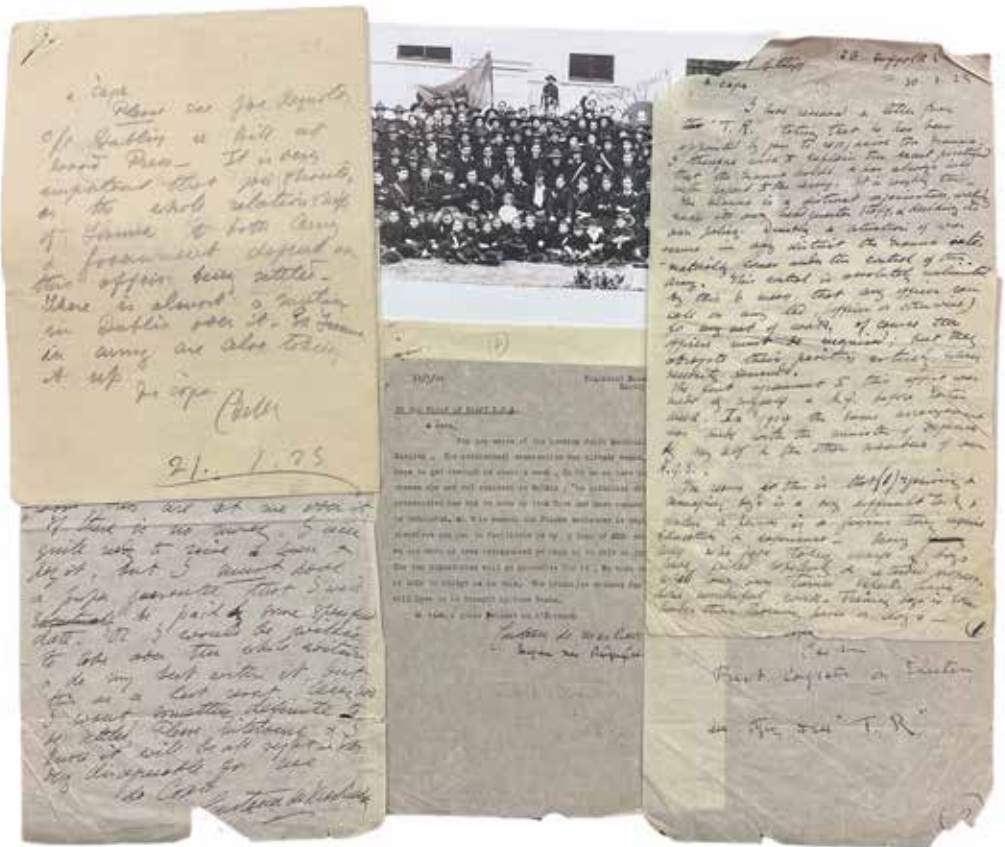

A file of Correspondence relating to Fianna Éireann and its relations with the Post-Treaty I.R.A., 1923-25, approx. 23 letters, draft letters and memos, mostly unsigned typescript carbon copies from various I.R.A. officers but including five manuscript letters and memos in the Countess' hand and two T.L.S. by her, ending early in 1925, two years before her death, and a year before she joined Fianna Fail on its launch.

The File was presumably compiled by someone in I.R.A. HQ. It begins with a letter from the Countess to [Chief] of Staff dated 30.8.23, saying she has 'received a letter from "T.R." stating that he has been appointed by you to reorganize the Fianna'. She explains that the Fianna is a distinct organization, with its own headquarters staff & deciding its own policy – and so by implication is not to be reorganized by anyone appointed by the I.R.A. The Chief of Staff (unnamed) replies that they have no intention of taking over the Fianna, but they tried some months ago to get in touch with some of the old Fianna G.H.Q. staff and could find none [the Countess may have been in jail at the time]. 'I am very glad you are still interested in the Fianna Organisation and I am sure T.R. and yourself can come to a satisfactory arrangement ..' Later letters include a request for a small loan to pay expenses of witnesses at 'the pending court marshal [sic] of Sean Harling', difficulties in contacting B[arney] Mellows, an appeal from the Countess for financial assistance with the bill for reprinting the Fianna Handbook, a collection for funds to assist Fianna ex-prisoners (24.11.24), etc.



Condition varies but generally good.
The Correspondence illustrates the decline and disarray of the Anti-Treaty Republican groups after the end of the Civil War, and shows a degree of mutual impatience between its various components. Fianna Éireann was founded in 1909 by the Countess and Bulmer Hobson as a national alternative to the

Boy Scout movement; a few years later it became effectively the youth wing of the Irish Volunteers.

The Countess's Manuscript Letters are on large sheets of flimsy paper and are very fragile, please handle carefully.

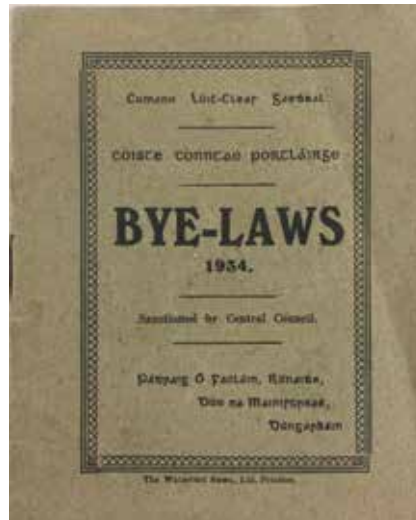
It was at this match that British soldiers opened fire on the pitch and crowd, killing a player and twelve spectators. This followed Michael Collins' operation against British secret service agents earlier that morning, in which fourteen British officers were shot dead. The period 1918 - 1920 was a turbulent and dangerous period in Irish History. Martial Law was enforced in many areas, and the activities of the G.A.A. and other Sporting Organisations were severely curtailed. The behaviour of the British Forces in Ireland forced many young men to join the Irish Volunteers, and other Republican Organizations despite having no background in the movement. Especially in Tipperary, many young men of the time, and particularly those involved in Gaelic Games joined in the struggle for Irish Independence. With such exciting events as the Rescue of Sean Hogan at Knocklong Railway Station in May 1919, several of the country's leading Footballers became involved in the War of Independence. By early March 1920 the number of Gaelic Games played almost came to a standstill. This trend continued into the early summer when normally the volume of activity should have been increasing. In October there came a sudden and brief revival of Inter-County Fixtures. However, the following month was to have a tragic outcome. In early October, approximately five thousand spectators who had so far that year had little exciting fare were entertained by a rousing Challenge Football Match in Croke Park, between Dublin and Kildare, which

Dublin won. Soon afterwards, the Tipperary County Board issued a challenge to Dublin. A match was arranged for 2.45 p.m. on Sunday November 21st, again at Croke Park. The game was well organised, and advertised as The G.A.A. Challenge Match. It was intended that the money raised from the match would help the Association for the Dependents of the I.R.A. who had been killed or imprisoned. The events which occurred at that game, now known as "Bloody Sunday," followed the early morning assassination of eleven British Intelligence Agents, "The Cairo Gang," in an operation organized by Michael Collins. When the British retaliated later that day, it was to Croke Park that the Military and Auxiliary Forces came, recognizing that the Stadium was the centre and symbol of Irish Nationalism and Nationalistic Aspirations. "Then suddenly and without any warning, Croke Park was the scene of a holocaust" They fired into the crowd indiscriminately, killing twelve people and wounding about sixty, "On the field Michael Hogan, one of the Tipperary backs (and one of only two Irish Volunteer Officers on the Tipperary Team) lay mortally wounded, while within seconds a dozen spectators were dead or dying, many more seriously wounded." This was Bloody Sunday. Nothing more strikingly illustrates the close connections between the G.A.A. and the Republican Movement between 1916 and 1922, than "Bloody Sunday"; together with a black and white pen photograph of Thomas McPartin in his 'Na Fianna Éireann Uniform,' and his enamel Fianna Éireann Badge, as a collection. 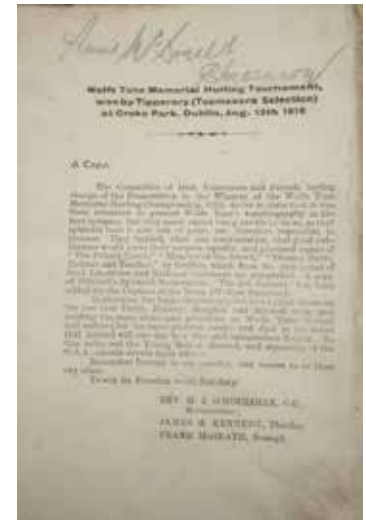

Note: Jack and Mick Darcy were born in Grange, Nenagh. Jack was born in 1898 and Mick in 1901. They received their early education in the Convent National School and in Nenagh C.B.S. Fr. William O'Kennedy, a family relation, was on the staff of St. Flannan's College, Ennis and the brothers were sent there to complete their secondary education.

Jack played for Flannans in the Munster Colleges' Hurling league, a competition which pre dated the Harty Cup hurling competition. He was the contemporary of the great Tommy Daly, who was a student in Flannan's when he won a Junior All Ireland with Clare in 1914. Mick was to continue the link with Tommy Daly later.

The Harty Cup was presented in 1918 by Archbishop J.M. Harty, Archbishop of Cashel, for a hurling competition between the secondary schools and colleges in Munster. This was organised by the Dr. Harty Cup Committee and was not directly affiliated to the G.A.A. Flannan's entered this competition but did not have any success. Mick was a member of the Harty Cup team.

Jack Darcy went to U.C.G. and became an engineer with Cork Corporation. He played inter county hurling for Tipperary from 1919 - 1927. Transport was scarce at the time and he travelled from Cork on his motorbike for training and matches. Micheál Ó Muircheartaigh has described him as "The original Hell's Angel".

Mick Darcy went to U.C.D. where he continued his hurling career. In 1923 he played in the Fitzgibbon cup with U.C.D. This team was captained by Tommy Daly of Clare. In 1923 and '24 he played Senior hurling for Dublin. He won a senior All Ireland Medal in

1924 when Dublin defeated Galway on a scoreline of 5-3 to 2-6. Two other famous non-Dublin natives who were on that team were Tommy Daly of Clare and Garret Howard of Limerick.

1924 also saw the revival of the ancient Tailteann Games. The Government donated 10,000 Pounds to help fund the competitions. It was decided that one of the events would be a hurling match between Ireland and the exiles. The brothers were selected to play on the Irish team, Jack at corner back and Mick at centre field. In modern times they were the first brothers to receive All Star Awards on the same team.

In 1925, having completed his studies in U.C.D., Mick declared for Tipperary and both brothers lined out for Tipperary. Tipperary defeated Cork and Waterford in Munster, Antrim in the semi final and Galway in the final.

In 1926 it was decided that the Tipperary team would undertake a tour of America. The tour would last from May to July. Not all members of the Government were happy with the tour as they felt that it was a cover for fund raising for the I.R.A. Both Darcy brothers were in "Government jobs", Jack with Cork Corporation and Mick with the Civil Service. They were refused permission to go on the trip and were told that if they did go, they would "have no jobs to come back to". Their mother decided that they should remain at home reminding them that they had permanent and pensionable jobs. Jobs were scarce in the 1920's and she was not going to allow her sons to abandon their careers over hurling. She had her way and the boys remained at home.

The tour took place. Tipperary played six games beating Offaly who were American Champions, a Cork selection, Chicago, Buffalo, San Francisco and New York. The publicity for the match in Chicago read "Come for an eyeful of sport, fifteen hundred years old. Arms and legs snap occasionally". The victorious Tipperary team returned in July. They called themselves "The World Champions".

When the team returned, the Darcy brothers rejoined the panel. Tipperary beat Limerick in the Munster semi final and faced Cork in the final. The match was fixed for the Athletic Grounds, Cork. Over 26,000 people paid in. Spectators were almost on the pitch. After 16 minutes the match was abandoned as the spectators were constantly spilling onto the pitch. Tipperary were leading by 1-2 to no score. The replay took place in Thurles. It was the first Gaelic Match to be broadcast. It ended in a draw Cork 4-1 Tipperary 3-4. The second replay was also played in Thurles. After ten minutes Tipperary mid fielder Martin Mockler was sent off. From then on Tipperary were fighting a rear guard battle. Cork were the winners on a scoreline of 3-6 to 2-4.

Neither brother was to win another All Ireland medal. Mick continued his association with hurling through U.C.D. where he was a trainer and selector for many years. He became private secretary to Dan Morrissey, a fellow Nenagh man in the second inter-party government '54-'57. When Dan Morrissey retired from politics to form a highly successful auctioneering business, he retired from the Civil Service to join him. He died in Dublin in 1964. Jack Darcy continued to work for Cork Corporation and became City Engineer. He married a Clare woman, Ivy Hannan from Newmarket on Fergus. He died in Cork in 1972.

**First Ever All-Ireland Football Medal, 1887
Won by Limerick Commercials**

Medal: G.A.A. - Football, 1887: A magnificent 9ct gold Medal issued to commemorate the first ever All-Ireland football Championship, 1887, hall marked, & with name of retailer A. Duffner, Tipperary.

The Medal was won by Jeremiah Kennedy of Limerick Commercials, Limerick, who beat Young Irelands of Louth, on a score line of 1-4 to 0-3. The match was played on a field in Clonskeagh known as 'The Big Bank' on April 28, 1888.

The style of the Medal is in what is now known as the traditional G.A.A. Celtic Cross design., of a cross super imposed on a circle, & with the engraved arms of Munster on a shield overlaid in centre, the obverse inscribed 'Central Council-Eire-G.A.A. C.Ship,' & with the left & right points of the cross with the date 18-87, the reverse is engraved, 'First All Ireland F. Championship, Won by Lmck. Commercials, J.J. Kennedy.'

The Limerick team of 1887, were not photographed on the occasion of their win, they received no trophy, & really no recognition until they were issued with this medal in 1912, the occasion when the above photograph was taken. By that time a lot of the excitement generated by the initial championship had dissipated, and some of the team emigrated, as with the recipient of the above medal.



The following Year 1888, the championship was unfinished, owing to the famous 'U.S.A. Invasion' by G.A.A. athletes. Having won the inaugural championship of 1887, Limerick won again in 1896, & these two years remain the only occasions in the proceeding years when Limerick collected the honours.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Fonsie Mealys, hereinafter called “the auctioneer” exercises all reasonable care to ensure that all descriptions are reliable and accurate, and that each item is genuine unless the contrary is indicated. However, the descriptions are not intended to be, are not and are not to be taken to be, statements of fact or representations of fact in relation to the lot. They are statements of the opinion of the auctioneers, and attention is particularly drawn to clause 5 set out below. Comments and opinions, which may be found in or on lots as labels, notes, lists, catalogue prices, or any other means of expression, do not constitute part of lot descriptions and are not to be taken as such unless they are made or specifically verified by the auctioneers.

Clause 1

- (a) Each lot is put up subject to any reserve price imposed by the vendor
- (b) Subject to sub-clause (a) of this clause, the highest bidder for each lot shall be the purchaser thereof
- (c) If any dispute arises as to the highest bidder the auctioneer shall have absolute discretion to determine the dispute and may put up again and resell the lot in respect of which the dispute arises.

Clause 2

Clause 5

- (a) All lots are made available for inspection before each sale and each buyer, by making a bid, acknowledges that he has satisfied himself as to the physical condition, age and catalogue

description of each lot (including but not restricted to whether the lot is damaged or has been repaired or restored).

(b) All lots are sold with all faults and imperfections and errors of description and the Auctioneer and its employees, servants or agents shall not be responsible for any error of description or for the condition or authenticity of any lot, save for Clause 5 (c) below. (b) The Auctioneer or its employees, servants or agents may, on request organise packing and shipping of lots purchased or may order on the buyer's behalf third parties to pack or ship purchases. Under no circumstances does the Auctioneer accept any liability whatsoever for any loss or damage howsoever occasioned in the course of such service.

(c) The buyer authorises the Auctioneer to use any photographs or illustrations of any lot purchased for any or all purposes as the Auctioneer may require. The placing of a bid will be taken as full agreement to all the above conditions.
